Strange But True

Accidents kill and cripple more children than all the infectious diseases of childhood put together.

In 1950 children under one year of age died from accidents of all types at a rate of 72.1 each 100,000, with home accidents accounting for 43 deaths for each 100,000.

Children from 1 to 4 died at a rate of 37.8 for each 100,000 with 11.6 deaths due to motor accidents, 9.4 to fires and explosions, and burns, and 5.5 to drowning.

Between the ages of 5 and 9 the total child accident rate dropped to 22.3 for each 100,000 with automobiles and trucks the biggest killers, accounting for 9.6 deaths.

From 10 to 14 the total death rate was 22.7 for each 100,000 and motor-vehicles caused 7.8 deaths. From 15 to 19 the total death rate jumped to 47.2 with automobiles and trucks taking their heaviest toll - 27 for each 100,000.

Special blue foxes are installed for air mail because it is collected and despatched separately. A blue air mail label (obtained free from any post office) should be placed on the top left corner of the envelope to insure speedy delivery.

EMBASSY REOPENED

LONDON, (AP)—A top Iranian diplomat arrived Thursday and re-opened the embassy closed 15 months ago when Iran's former premier, Mohammed Mossadeq, severed diplomatic ties with Britain.

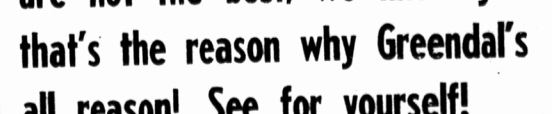
