### LADY SARAH WILSON.

One of the most notable of the English war correspondents in South Africa is Lady Sarah Wilson, sister of the Duke of Marlborough, and who was before her marriage Lady Sarah Spencer-Churchill. Lady Sarah went out with the first troops, and is the correspondent at Mafeking for the London 'Daily Mail.' In the beleaguered town she is sharing the privations and discomforts of the besieged residents and noting from day to day the progress of events. Her despatches from Mafeking have shown the brutal disregard of the Boers in their wanton cruelty of shelling the laager containing the women and children.

Private Austin Chisholm writes a letter to his mother at Goderich in which he says: "I forgot to tell you in my other letters that on the day of the battle of Paardeberg Drift Father O'Leary was right up in the firing line with us, tending to the wounded and administering the last sacraments to the dying. He is very brave and the soldiers think there is nobody like Father O'Leary. I would not take a fortune and stay in this country and I shall be glad when we sight Canada again."

It has been well remarked the Boer delegates to the United States must be careful how they speak. Any very strong condemnation of British policy in South Africa would be an equally strong arraignment of United States policy in the Philippines. The case of Britain in South Africa is admittedly scarcely parallel to that of the United States in the Philippines. But the difference is altogether on the British side. The Boer attacked British territory, but the Filipinos are simply defending their own country. It is true that the United States paid \$20,000,000 for the Philippines; the money, however, was paid to Spain, and not to the residents of the country. The Boer delegates will have to tread lightly or they will get into trouble.

Private Kilpatrick, of "G" Company, in a letter from Bloemfontein, says: "We all need clothes in the worst way, as we are simply in rags, but we are no worse than the other troops around us."

We are a lucky lot of fellows to have had a chance to figure in such an important engagement. There never was a war in the history of the world where so little damage was done to property by the invading forces at this one. I met a Canadian recently who has been here for some years. He came from Toronto. He took six of us to his house and we had the first meal seated at a table with a linen cloth on it since leaving home. His wife and two daughters waited on us in good style and we spent a pleasant hour with them.

In a letter to his mother at Bradford, Ont. Private Alfred Sherritt says: "I think we will be on the march to Pretoria before you receive this, if Kruger does not weaken. We have our little duty to do until the end comes whatever that end may be death or a triumphant return to the old home. I hope that in our cases it may be the latter."
