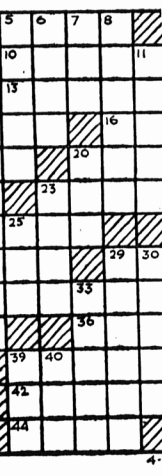

Eggs And Poultry
 The egg market has developed a slightly easier undertone this week. Supplies, as reported, are slightly in excess of demand and as a result paying prices have been reduced three to four cents on AL and AM. Production shows an increase over previous week but indications are this is nearing the peak. Receipts were much heavier over the week end, this being due to improved road conditions. Graded shipments are moving out steadily to other Atlantic Provinces.

Dealers are now quoting for ungraded eggs delivered: AL 42, AM 40, AS 33, B 33, C 20; and for the graded pack delivered: AL 49, AM 47, AS 40, B 40, C 27; and are quoting retailers in cartons: AL 56, AM 54, B 47. Retail to consumer prices as yet have not been adjusted with price declines and are retailing at: AL 67-69, AM 64-66, B 53-55.

Comments: Egg prices in this market have strengthened, origin 90% Prince Edward Island, balance Nova Scotia. Receipts of Grade A Large are in liberal supply. A Medium in short supply, all other grades are still off. The demand is fair to good.

Comments: Egg receipts as reported by registered stations continue in about the same volume. With the arrival of two cars from Ontario the past week, dealers report supplies ample for requirements. Demand is good. Paying prices are unchanged but costs to retailers have been reduced. Quality is very good.

F. E. I. Hatchery Comments
 After getting away to a slow start, hatcheries are now operating to capacity or as near to capacity

as egg supply will permit. The demand for pullet chicks is excellent due to the strong egg market that has been present this spring. The New Hampshire X Barred Plymouth Rock cross is ever increasing in popularity and this year is no exception.

It is interesting to note that many of our breeders are developing strains of fast feathering Barred Plymouth Rocks. These birds have excellent type, livability and egg producing qualities combined with the fast feathering factor. This product will be ready for release next hatching season and is a major step by Island breeders in their race to supply the needs of the fast changing poultry industry.

Potatoes
 Tignish—Considerable table stock moving at 40c per 75 lbs. delivered. No seed moved this week.
 Borden Line—Considerable table stock moving. Light movement in seed.
 Kensington—Very good movement in table stock at 40c per 75 lbs. Seed not moving.

Morell—Loading considerable seed this week, Cobblers, Katahdins, and Sebagoes. Some table stock moving.
 Montague—Table stock movement fair. A few cars moving at 40c per 75 lbs. delivered. Small boat expected soon. No seed moving.

Souris—Seed moving at rate of five or six cars a week. Price about 45c a bushel. Some table stock moving at 34c a bushel.

There has been a very heavy movement of potatoes both seed and table stock during April. To date this month some 680 carloads have been shipped with the bulk going to Ontario and Quebec destinations.

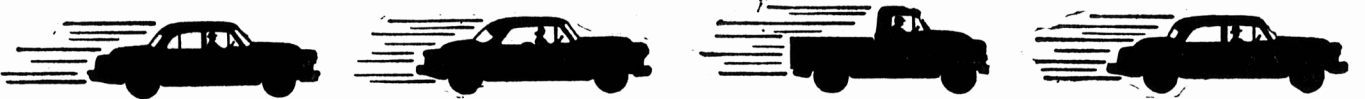
