(CP)—With the conditions of the fishery steadily improving, the pulp and paper industries, electric and vast mining operations underway, Premier Smallwood of Newfoundland has shifted his sights to another far-reaching plan which he hopes will contribute to the massive economic development of Newfoundland. When Mr. Smallwood looks forward to his next project, he says a great seaport, ice-free year round, situated on the major shipping routes of the world and offering manufacturers and industrialists all the cheap electric power they can use. Unsettling is an occupational disease of Congo residents. In July, 1960, Congolese soldiers, drunk on looted beer, raped and killed, tens of thousands of terrified Belgians fled and the Congo shattered itself into warring factions. That brought the UN here. The Congolese have taken a step back to something vaguely resembling normalcy. The Congo to-day is a nation again. Granted peace, the economy will soon be on the road to recovery.
