Mine Workers Request Coal Market Allocation

By JOHN LeBLANC. Canadian Press Staff Writer. OTTAWA (CP) — Nova Scotia miners want the federal government to allocate that province's distressed coal industry enough of the present import market to keep the province's miners at work, their chief said Monday.

Here for a coal conference today with federal ministers, president Bill Marsh of District 26 of the United Mine Workers of America (Ind.) suggested an additional \$4,000,000 a year might be needed from the central government for the next five years.

Mr. Marsh said in an interview that the UMW wants some 2,500,000 tons per year of presently imported coal switched to Nova Scotia producers to keep mines alive in Cape Breton, with the federal treasury footing the bill.
