Wellington Co-op Is Praised For Its Community Efforts

SUMMERSIDE - Reid Sangster, provincial marketing director, and chairman of the provincial housing commission was guest speaker Thursday night at the 25th anniversary meeting of the Wellington Co-op held in the Wellington Legion Home.

Other speakers at the meeting were Rt. Rev. J.N. Porlier, Fred Sabine, J.G. Deming, Kelly, John Weir, Fred Taylor, Keith Harrington and Louis O'Connor.

Mr. Sangster said people must believe in the province and work together co-operatively to build a better community. He said he noted that this spirit of co-operation was very strong among French-Canadians, and complimented those in attendance for putting into practice the "love principle" which the Wellington Co-op formed 25 years ago.

Former Resident Dies In Ontario
A former Islander, Fred E. Hughes died recently in Trenton, Ont., at the age of 57 years. He was a son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Edwin Hughes of this province and lived in the Trenton area for some 20 years after moving to Ontario from P.E.I.
