Survey Team Finishes Job Despite Tough Conditions

OTTAWA (CP) — A government survey team has successfully mapped a barren stretch of Labrador under the most arduous and dangerous winter conditions ever encountered in the history of federal surveying.

TURNSTILES DRAW LAUGHS

LONDON (AP)—A debate over penny turnstiles in women's lavatories flooded the House of Commons with laughter.

Both Conservatives and Labor MPs are agreed that the turnstiles must go because they make life unnecessarily difficult for program, stump or package-laden women. The conflict is over who's to get the credit.

Labor MP Barbara Castle claimed the Conservative government had tricked her out of raising the question so that it could be raised instead by Dame Irene Ward of the Conservative ranks.

Determined not to let the Conservative steal her thunder, Mrs. Castle put in a bill of her own to abolish the turnstiles. But the Conservatives will probably beat her to the gate. Their bill was put down for debate April 5, Mrs. April 25.

Whatever the outcome, British women still will have to pay their pennies — into slots on the doors instead of turnstiles.

Thompson Sees Party In Power

OTTAWA (CP)—Social Credit Leader Thompson said his party is confident of winning 60 Quebec seats and enough others to form a minority government in Monday's general election.

He told about 200 Ottawa area Social Credit party workers that his party will be the only one to make gains. He predicted declines for the Conservatives, Liberal and New Democratic parties.

SUMMARIES PICTURE From east to west, Mr. Thompson summarized the Social Credit picture as he sees it this way:

Quebec—"Our people are enthused with the possibility of winning 60."

Ontario—"Confident of winning three — Glenora — Prescott, Simcoe North and Dufferin-Simcoe—and making yards in Northern Ontario and southwestern Ontario."

Manitoba—"Our workers are exuberant... and expect to take five or more seats."

Saskatchewan—"The Liberals are going to place... and it's the last stronghold of Conservatives in Canada."

Alberta—"Twelve... and possibly one or two more."

British Columbia—"We will double at least, and possibly triple or quadruple (the two B.C. seats Social Credit held in the last Parliament)."

EDMONTON (CP)—Canada's Girl Guides will soon have new uniforms and a new program. These are among changes being studied for the movement to adapt it to present-day needs.

A uniform which will adapt itself better to all Guide activities and a program to meet the growing sophistication of young girls are being developed, Miss Oster said in an interview.

She said the new program must be flexible enough to fit all girls. Studies on changes in uniforms, programs and organization were started 18 months ago and decisions will not be released for several months, she said.

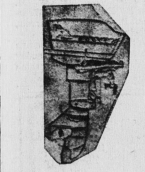
