

DOWN THE BACK STRETCH

The first \$50,000 National Championship race is to be staged at Yonkers Raceway in about two weeks' time, and horses eligible are being checked and in-lotions will be extended to in to race for the big stake.

One of the eligibles that is drawing a lot of attention is Ken-J, whose driver is Hughie J. He is a junior free-for-all and has won four races out of them in 2.03 or better in a half-mile track.

Under special conditions for National Championships, a horse is a free-for-all gets four for winning, three for second, two for third and one point placing fourth. In any other race, not a free-for-all, the winner gets four points if the time is .03 or faster. At the present time, Ken-J has twelve points heads such outstanding paces as Widower Creed, Speedy, Dianne Hanover and Bye Byrd.

On Saturday night, at Yonkers Raceway, Ken-J was an 11-10 favorite in the \$10,000 Million-Dollar Handicap, beating favored Duane over and Hundred Proof, and winning this victory race set by Ted Gibbons promoted eight-year-old gelding to the for-all class.

This has been the coldest spring on record for preparing trotters and drivers that we can recall at the track. Thursday morning, a strong breeze, two miles of the Joe Hennessey were cut loose in the last half of the mile. From where were sitting they seemed to be on even terms. The time was 14 2/5 seconds, the fastest we have observed this year.

The horses were Bertram Hanover, 2.03 2/5, and Sky Prince 2.03 2/5, owned by Sam Johnston and Stewart, respectively.

There is nobody in the Maritimes who has had such outstanding pacers, and it is possible that he is now the owner of a four-year-old — Licking Time, 2:07 3/5 — that in a couple of years will be racing for the big money.

After astonishing everyone by winning at Seckville Downs on a cold night recently in 2:10 1/5, which was seconds better than any performance prior to, or since then, Licking Time has now been shipped to Foxboro, Mass., or will be shipped in the near future, to that raceway, where he is staked. We understand he is also staked at several other tracks this season.

At Yonkers Raceway this week, the \$4,000 Trot was won by Dunden B., driven by Wendell Watson of Fort Fairfield, Maine. Butch Hanover (J. O'Brien) was second, time 2:05 2/5. On the same card, a \$3,000 Trot was won by Sova Hanover, driven by Earl Avery, time 2:04 4/5. The fastest mile of the night was in the \$3,000 Pace, won by Hal Reward (Fitzpatrick), time 2:03 2/5.

Now that the weatherman has changed his mind and is giving us some sunny weather, we expect to see a great gathering at the Charlottetown Raceway tonight. Some of the best of the 175 trotters and pacers stabled here will be giving their best and will be urged on by drivers who are anxious to win, not only for their own sake, but for the owners they represent. They are all fine fellows, and you will see clean racing and good sportsmanship. Remember, this is free-for-all night! So don't be surprised if they pace in the vicinity of 2:10.

QUEBEC, (CP) — The Canadian Boxing Federation considers Marcel Gendron a contender for the vacant Canadian bantamweight title following his deposit of \$200 Friday.

Gene Letourneau, national commissioner, said the deposit was made by Gendron's manager, Joe Legare. The Quebec City boxer wants to meet one of: Gerry Simpson, Montreal; Johnny Davidson, Glace Bay, N.S.; or Jimmy Hurley, Brantford, Ont.

The bantamweight title has been vacant since Pat Supple of Montreal retired from boxing this spring. Letourneau said a bout could be held here or in Halifax depending on whom Gendron would be fighting.

Round Table Ends Layoff

CHICAGO (AP)—Round Table, money-winningest horse in the racing business, is slated to end a four-month layoff today to resume as favorite in the \$7,800 Citation Handicap field of 13.

The five-year-old who has earned \$1,363,189 for Travis M. Kerr, will carry 130 pounds in Balmoral's mile feature at Washington Park, spotting rivals 19 to 26 pounds.

Round Table appeared in recent workouts to have fully recovered from the foreleg injury suffered last Feb. 23.

Round Table will be ridden by Steve Brooks. His regular pilot, Willie Shoemaker, is committed to Brookmeade Stable's Sword Dancer in the Belmont handicap.

Chicago Cubs kayoed starter Lew Burdette with three-run clusters in the first two innings Friday and then had to hang on to defeat league-leading Milwaukee Braves 9-7.

A five-run Milwaukee rally featured by Johnny Logan's three-run homer in the seventh inning put the Braves within striking distance. But reliever Bill Henry kept the power-happy Braves in check and saved the decision for starter John Buzhardt.

Burdette, seeking his 10th triumph, had to settle for his fifth loss after taking a sound pounding in the first two innings. It was also the fourth time in a row that the righthanded star has failed to go the distance.

With two outs in the first inning, Lee Walls and Ernie Banks clobbered Burdette for homers. Still another run came across on a single by Del Log and Bobby Thomson's double.

The Cubs scored three more times in the second on Buzhardt's double and singles by Tony Taylor, Al Dark, an infield out by Walls and a single by Banks.

Milwaukee broke into the scoring column in the third inning on the first of two homers by Eddie Mathews and was blanked until the seventh while the Cubs pecked away for a run in the fourth and two in the sixth to build up a 9-1 lead.

BOSTON, (AP) — Tom Sturdivant, coming on in relief with the bases loaded and no one out, choked off Boston's biggest threat Friday night and preserved a 3-1 victory for Kansas City Athletics.

Sturdivant's solid performance saved the game for Rip Coleman, Athletic left-hander who had a four-hit shutout going until the Red Sox climbed on him in the eighth.

Harry Child blasted his first home run of the season into the

left field screen in the fourth inning with two mates aboard for all of Kansas City's runs. The blast came off starter and loser Frank Sullivan.

PITTSBURGH (AP) — Los Angeles Dodgers scored three runs in the ninth inning Friday night and broke up a tie game for a 9-6 victory over Pittsburgh Pirates in a slugfest.

The Dodgers had 17 hits and the Pirates 13. Los Angeles used seven pitchers with credit for the victory going to Danny McDevitt, now 4-6.

The Pirates used six pitchers with the loss being charged to Bennie Daniels (3-5).

The game lasted three hours and 35 minutes, just eight minutes short of a National League record for a nine-inning game.

The Dodgers' Don Demeter hit a two-run homer over the left field scoreboard in the fifth. The blow was Demeter's 13th of the year and chased the Pirates' starting pitcher, Harvey Had dix, to the showers.

NEW YORK, (AP) — Detroit Tigers jumped into a third place, within two games of the American League lead by whipping New York 3-1 Friday night behind the six-hit pitching of left-hander Don Mossi.

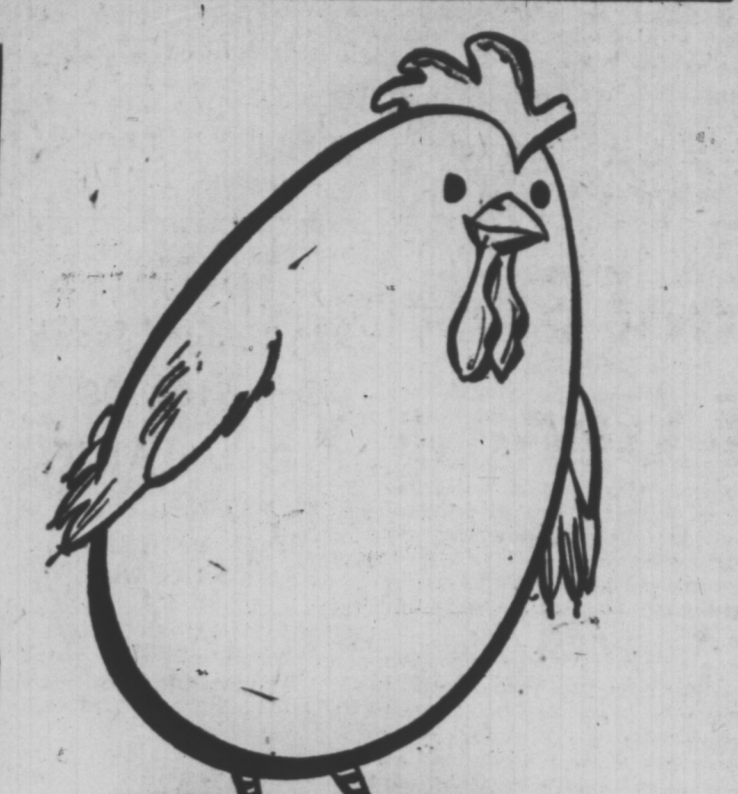
It was the seventh victory in eight games for the Tigers, lifting them into a deadlock with Baltimore Orioles, whose game with
