TORONTO (CP)—Industrialists fell to their lowest point in more than two years on the Toronto Stock Exchange Tuesday.

The industrial index was off 1.57 to 154.05, its lowest point since June 10, 1964.

Steels were weak with losses of 1/2 going to Stelco at 23 1/4, Algoma at 28 1/2 and Dofasco at 22 1/2.

Moore Corp. dipped 1 to 7 1/2, Simpsom's 1/2 to 28 1/2 and Alcan 1/2 to 31 1/2.

Among speculative, Quebec Mattagami was down 1 to 68 cents. Goldmin gained one cent at 74 cents.

On index, base metals fell 77 to 92.30, the TSE index 1.46 to 147.11 and golds 82 to 182.80.

Volume was 2,890,000 shares compared with 2,561,000 Monday.

MONTREAL (CP)—The composite, utilities and industrial indices fell one point or more on the Montreal Stock Exchange Tuesday.

Declines more than doubled advances, 64 to 23. The two-board total was 123 to 49.

Moore Corp. ended 1 1/2 points lower at 78 1/2, Canada Cement one point at 40. Down 1/2 on 3,662 shares was Alcan, while CPR eased 1/2 to 58 1/2.

Breweries weakened 1/2 to 7 and Distillers Seagrams closed 1/2 down at 29 1/2, with Massey-Ferguson down 1/2 to 32 1/2.

Utilities were off more than two points. Bell Telephone slid 1/2 to 50 and Nova Scotia Light 1/2 to 11 B.C. Telephone dropped 2 1/2 points to 60 1/2 on 75 shares. Royal stood 1/2 off at 70 and Montreal 1/4 at 56 1/2 among the banks.

Senior steels were shaded, with Dominion Foundries and Steel of Canada dipping 1/2 to 22 1/2 and 23 1/4.
