Gov't Fixes Targets For Employment

OTTAWA (CP) — The Liberal government has set its sights on a target of full employment in Canada.
Since taking office 61 days ago, it has unveiled a flood of measures aimed at achieving the "highest possible levels of employment."

More than 150,000 jobs have been earmarked as federal aid to the provinces for its vocational school program. Another \$300,000 will be spent for winter works incentives.

MONTREAL (CP) — A series of trade talks scheduled for next year are expected to be the most important held under the General Agreement of Tariffs and Trade since the end of the Second World War, Christian A. Herter, U.S. president's special trade negotiator, said here.

He told the annual meeting of the Canadian Council of the International Chamber of Commerce that the resulting economic benefits to the Western world and the consequent acceleration in the development of new countries "will be a major factor in strengthening the free world."
