U. K. DEFENCE PLANS

LONDON, July 11.—(Reuters)—Britain is budgeting to spend an extra 3,000,000 pounds (\$9,300,000) this year on Western Union Defence, a Government white paper giving supplementary civil estimates revealed today. This extra sum was needed for the construction or development of military works—headquarters, communications and airfields—as part of the plans of the Brussels treaty powers it was stated.
