Local and Other Items

—Look out for the Defaulters List.

—The meeting of the Natural History and Antiquarian Society next Monday evening will be held in the Y. M. C. A. Parlor and promises to be an interesting one. All interested are invited to attend.

—Mr. Vinnicombe's orchestra is preparing for the opening concert at the rink. Judging by last night's practice Mr. Vinnicombe is going to give the people of Charlottetown a treat at the big opening night.

—The Minto left Pictou at half-past seven this morning and reached Charlottetown about half-past one o'clock, bringing a large freight, the mails and a number of passengers. She will leave on return to Pictou to-morrow morning at seven o'clock.

—We insert the letter of Mr. Justice Hodgson with great pleasure, and we shall not quarrel with him because he will not accept THE EXAMINER'S excuse for a somewhat too frequent use of the title of "Honorable." His remarks concerning inexact language are not without cause; and it is equally true that inexact language betrays inexactness of thought and action.

—The report that Archbishop Duhamel is to be created a Cardinal is denied. The authorities at the Archbishop's Palace say the circulation of the rumor is due to the fact that two French clerical reviews, La Croix, published by the Assumptionist Fathers, and La Pretre, mentioned the name of Archbishop Duhamel as a possible candidate for the cardinalate.

—At a meeting of the Canadian Patriotic Fund Association held at Ottawa a few days ago, reports were submitted showing that 324 dependents of soldiers had been assisted, and that 108 invalided soldiers had also received assistance to whom payments amounting to \$25,837, and \$2,287 respectively had been made. The treasurer's statement showed \$335,609 remaining for distribution.
