Slow Trading In N. Y. Stocks

NEW YORK (AP)—Wall street last week showed its extreme doubt concerning the immediate outlook for business as stock market trading sank to its lowest level in nearly four years.

Among Canadian issues on the American Exchange, Loblaw rose 1/4 to 94 1/2, Jupiter Oils gained 1/8 to 3 1/4 and Richwell Petroleum gained 1/4 to 1 1/4. Canadian Marconi dropped 1/4 to 3 and Molybdenite dropped 1/4 to 1 1/2.

Among Canadian issues on the New York Exchange, International Nickel dropped 3/4 points to 84. Granby Mining dropped 1/2 to 6 1/2 and Canadian Pacific dropped 1/4 to 41 1/4. Aluminium Ltd. closed at 40 after losing 1 1/2 points. Walker-Gooderham gained 1/4 to 76.

Slight Upturn In Steel Demand

CLEVELAND (AP)—Buying for production of 1958-model automobiles is the main cause of a slight upturn in steel demand, Steel Magazine says. It reports that cold-rolled carbon sheets are the most favored in the upturn in demand and production.

Not every product is sharing in the order increase. Items in stronger demand include hot-rolled carbon sheets, cold-finished carbon bars and high carbon spring wire for autos.

Steel ingot production rose for the fourth straight week, reaching 83 per cent of capacity. That is half a point above output the previous week and equivalent to 2,124,000 net tons.

Also exerting increased demand for steel, says the magazine, is the implement industry, operating at 11- to 20-per-cent above year-ago levels with the prospect that this increased pace will continue.

Steel predicted that an anticipated 10-per-cent increase in production of household equipment next year will mean more business for part-makers. But the magazine adds that the long-term trend among appliance manufacturers is to make rather than to buy.

Scrap prices continue to sag for the third straight week. In the week ended Sept. 4, Steel Magazine's price composite on steel-making grades of scrap dropped 34 cents to \$51.53 a gross ton.

TO VISIT TWIN

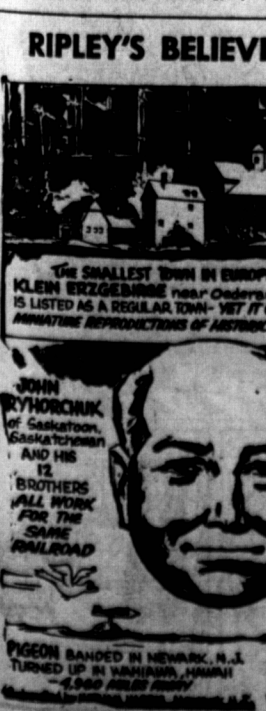

WARSAW (AP)—Kazimierz Jaworski, a former member of the Polish government, has fled to the West. It was disclosed here Saturday. He is believed to be the highest-ranking Polish Communist to defect so far. Jaworski was vice-minister of construction until early this year. He then lost his job in the government reshuffle and was appointed director of the construction research institute.

Alleged Smuggling Ring Leader Surrenders In N. Y.

NEW YORK (AP)—Harry Stromberg, alleged kingpin of a huge international narcotics smuggling ring, surrendered today in the office of U.S. attorney Paul W. Williams, ending a search by narcotics agents.

Stromberg alias Nig Rosen, described as a prominent racketeer figure in New York City, Philadelphia and Miami, was among 46 defendants—three of them Canadians—named in a narcotics conspiracy indictment which was setting up to \$20,000,000 a year, opened Wednesday.

He was tabbed the mastermind of an international narcotics ring. In surrendering, the 54-year-old Russian-born Stromberg kept a promise made through a lawyer Wednesday night. The lawyer made arrangements for the surrender.

Narcotics agents had been searching the city for Stromberg without success. In the indictment, 16 others were named as co-conspirators but not defendants. The indictment was returned Aug. 27 but kept sealed until Wednesday to permit arrests.
