FINANCIAL REPORT:

Glenn Hynes, treasurer of the Student Union, presented the council with the projected budget for the term May 1, 1982-April 30 1983 and the actual revenue and expenses up to the end

of December 1982. The budget set by Mr. Hynes prior to the term is proving to be very close to actual expenditures and revenue of the union, though the latter part of this term may prove to be a time of lessened revenue and therefore lessened expenditure by the council.

ELECTION:

The president of the Student Union pointed out that the constitution's guidelines for the holding of Student Union elections would place the election date in the middle of the University's spring break. Therefore 2nd Wednesday after the break would be most suitable for elections as at least a week is necessary for campaigning.

NEW SECRETARY

The 4 student union receptionists hired last term by the hiring board are unable to cover office this semester because of conflicting classes. An interim secretary was found to cover the times, but it was the feeling of the

council that applications should be opened for the position.

Motion: Trainor/Beattie to approve the appointment of an interim secretary and to strike a hiring board to hire a new secretary.
Carried Unanimously.

WINTER CARNIVAL

Brian Brennan, VP External, presented the council with tentative events that will be held during the Winter Carnival, to take place the first week of February.

TO ALL STUDENTS

RE: Income Tax Deductions

1. EDUCATION DEDUCTION CERTIFICATE (T2202A)

Full time students are eligible to deduct \$50 for each month of full-time attendance during the 1982 taxation year, provided the deduction is verified by the university.

Students who do not need the deduction for their own tax return should sign the approved form so that a parent, or spouse, may have the benefit of the deduction.

These forms are available in the Registrar's Office and should be picked up as soon as possible.

2. TUITION DEDUCTION

Full-time and part-time students may claim the amount of tuition paid provided the deduction is verified by the university on an approved form. Tuition deductions may not be claimed by anyone other than the student.

Income Tax Receipts for tuition paid may be picked up at the university Business Office.

Students who are unable to pick up these forms should contact the appropriate offices to have the forms mailed out.
