Prices declined on a broad front including most major sections of the market. Blue chips were hit hard in waves of selling.

The AP 60-stock average fell \$2.80 to \$211.50, its worst decline since Nov. 24 when it dropped \$5.20.

American Motors was the most active stock, off 1 at 32 1/2 on 79,800 shares. Second was Studebaker-Packard, off 1/4 at 13 on \$6,100 shares. Third was General Motors, off 1/4 at 45 1/4 on 43,300 shares.

Backing the downtrend, Lukens Steel rose 1/4, Haver 4 1/2, Grumman 1/2 and New York Shipbuilding 1/4.

Walker-Gooderham, up 1/2, was the only gainer among Canadian stocks on the New York exchange, while International Nickel lost 1/2, Aluminum Ltd., and Hudson Bay Mining & Co., Canadian Pacific, Distillers Seagrams and Granby Mining 1/4.

On the American exchange, Jupiter Oils and Sapphire Petroleum rose 1-16 while Shawingian lost 1/2, Brazilian Traction and Canadian Marconi 1/4 and Fargo Oil 7-16.

CURRENCIES

MONTREAL (CP) - The U.S. dollar closed Monday at a discount of 2 1/2 per cent in terms of Canadian funds, up 3-16. Pound sterling \$2.73 13-16, up 1/4.

TORONTO

TORONTO (CP) - The stock market received its sharpest setback since Nov. 24 as it dropped back Monday in moderate trading.

On index, industrials dipped 3 1/2 points. The third session in a row was lost. Base metals and wheat-oils lost 1/4 points and gold rose down a point.

The final volume was 3,221,000 shares, compared with Friday's \$52,000. Speculators were quiet. Consolidated Halliwell was the only issue over 100,000 shares. It lost 3 cents at 88 cents.

Senior mines, with the exception of Quomont, were fractions easier. Quomont gained 1/4 at 7 1/2. International Nickel lost 1/4 at 87 1/2. Falconbridge dipped 1/4 at 27 1/2 and Hudson Bay was off 1/4 at 61 1/4.

In golds Hollinger lost 1/4 at 1 1/4 and losses went to Campbell Red Lake and McIntyre. Canadian gold kilo bars were quoted \$34.12 to \$34.21 an ounce.

Western oils lost as Calgary and Edmonton and Home B each backed down 1/4. Pacific Petroleum was off 1/4 at 16 1/2. Among lower priced oils, Petrol was off 8 cents at \$1.95.

Index losses: Golds 1 1/2 to 3 1/2; base metals 1.50 to 184.22; western oils 1.54 to 140.44.

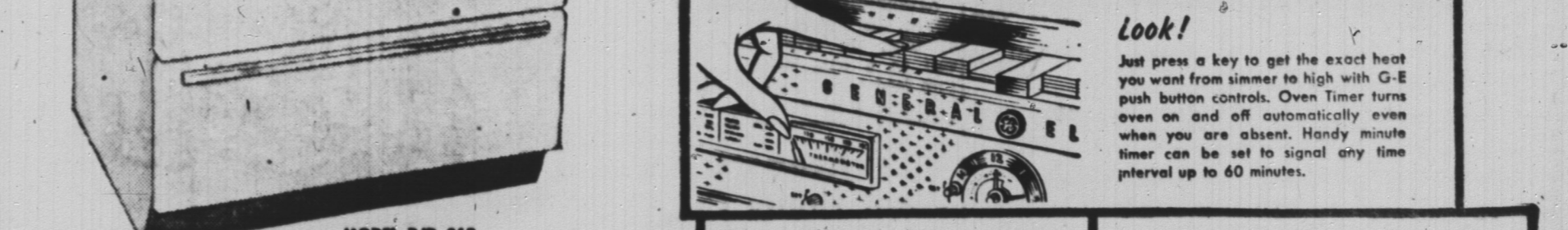
