HON. J. A. MacDONALD

Born April 12, 1874, at Tracadie, P.E.I., son of John C. MacDonald and Elizabeth Marie, his wife, both Scotch. Educated, Public School Tracadie. Married September 18, 1905, to Marie J., daughter of Capt. Joseph MacDonald, of Caragan, P.E.I. Eight children: Barbara Eleanor, Anna Elizabeth, Margaret Isabel, Charles Joseph, John Augustine, Marv Burke, Gertrude, David Bernard. A merchant and Produce Exporter. President, J. A. MacDonald & Co., Ltd., Cardigan, P.E.I. President, Associated Shippers Incorporated, Charlottetown, P.E.I. Secretary-Treasurer, Cardigan Electric Co. Ltd., Director, Cardigan Silver Fox Co., Ltd., Director, Georgetown Fish Co., Ltd. Minister without portfolio in the Matheson Government, 1911-15. Minister of Public Works and Highways P.E.I., 1923-25. Member of Charlottetown Club. Was Director of National Service and Hon. Fuel and Food Control Administrator for P.E.I. during the war. First elected to P.E.I. Legislature at g.e., 1908, and re-elected 1911 and 1923. First elected to H. of C. at g.e., Oct. 29, 1926. Sworn of the Privy Council and appointed Minister without Portfolio in Meighen Administration, July 13, 1926. Re-elected at g.e. 1926 and 1930. Appointed Minister without Portfolio in Mr. Bennett's Cabinet, Aug. 7, 1930. Summoned to the Senate July 20, 1935. A Conservative. Religion, Catholic. Cardigan, P.E.I.



HON. GEORGE D. DeBLOIS
Lieutenant-Governor, Province of Prince Edward Island. Born at Charlottetown October 21, 1887. Educated at St. Peter's Collegiate. Wholesale Merchant and Exporter; President firm of DeBlois Bros. Was President Conservative Association, Queen's County; Commissioner, Provincial Tuberculosis Sanatorium. Appointed Lieutenant-Governor Dec. 28, 1933. Party Politics, Conservative; Religion, Anglican, St. Paul's Church.



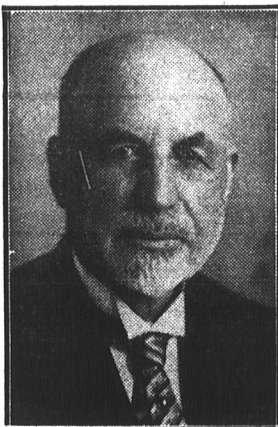
HON. JOHN EWEN SINCLAIR

Born Dec. 24, 1879, at Summerfield, P.E.I. Son of the late Peter Sinclair and Margaret McMurdo, his wife, both Scotch. Educated at Grammar School Springfield, P.E.I. Married Feb. 21, 1906, to Rebecca, daughter of late John C. Harding of Graham's Road, P.E.I. Three children: Margaret Jean, (married to A. B. Cutcliffe, Charlottetown, Rebecca Earith, (married to Dr. I. W. Jardine, Kensington, P. E. I.) and John Crawford. A farmer. Was a member of the Swine Commission which visited different countries in Europe, 1909. Unsuccessful candidate for Province g.e. 1st District of Queens in 1908. First elected to House of Commons for Queens in 1917. Re-elected 1921. Was sworn in a Privy Councillor and became a member of Liberal Government without portfolio, Dec. 30, 1921. Defeated at g.e., 1925; elect. at g.e. 1926. Summoned to the Senate, June 7, 1930. A Liberal. United Church. Summerfield Farm, Emerald, P.E.I.

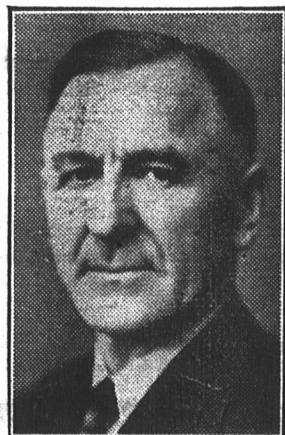


HON. ALFRED EDGAR MacLEAN

A farmer and trader, was educated at Lot 16 and Summerside High School. Married to Henrietta Staver of Kelvin, P. E. I. Director, A. E. MacLean Co. Ltd. Fox Farming, and Lot 16 Dairyng Association. He attended Truro Agricultural College and holds many cups and trophies for seedcorn and live stock. Mr. MacLean was a member of the Local Government for eight years. He is a member of the Board of Trade, member of the Montreal Reform Club, member of the Board of Presbyterian College, Montreal. He was elected to the House of Commons in 1921 re-elected 1925, 26, 30 and 1935. Politics—Liberal. Religion—Presbyterian.

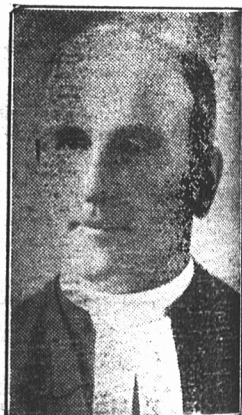


SENATOR J. J. HUGHES
Born at St. Mary's Road, P.E.I., 1856; educated at P.E.I. Public Schools and St. Dunstan's University, Charlottetown; elected to the House of Commons 1900; re-elected 1904, 1911, 1921; called to the Senate 1926. President of J.J. Hughes Co., Souris, P.E.I.; Governor of St. Dunstan's University; member Charlottetown Club, K.of C. Society. Politics, Liberal; religion, Roman Catholic.



JAMES LESTER DOUGLAS, M.P.

Was born at the Head of Hillsboro. Was in the railway service from 1902 to 1912, seven years as locomotive fireman and three years as engineer, and during that time he received the Royal Canadian Humane Association's medal for saving from drowning a young lad who had fallen over the wharf at Summerside. He was Secretary-Treasurer of the Brotherhood of Locomotive Fireman and Enginemen, and a delegate representing that body at the convention in Denver, Colorado, in 1919. For three years he was in Vancouver in the contracting business with the firm of Coffin & MacLellan. After returning to the Island he was engaged in farming and in the wholesale potato and turnip business. He is a graduate of the Charlottetown Business College, and is a Past Master of St. John's Masonic Lodge, also a Noble of the Mystic Shrine and member of the Philae Temple and is a member of the Order of Oddfellows. He is married to Miss Mabel Wright, R.N., of Alberton, and has a family of three. Religion, United Church of Canada. Politics, Liberal. Elected to House of Commons by acclamation bye-election 1933.



REV. R. HENSLEY STAVERT, M. A., B. D.
Moderator of Presbytery, P. E. I.

Born Wilnot Valley, second son of Peter B. and Elizabeth Auld Staver. Educated P.W.C., Taught School Preetown, M. A. Dalhousie University, B. D. Pine Hill College, B. D. Presbyterian College, Montreal. Called to following congregations: Harcourt, N. B., Noron, N. B., Brookfield, P. E. I. and to present charge Wood Islands. In Presbytery P. E. I. Convener Sunday Schools and Young People's Societies, convener Home Missions Committee and Clerk of Presbytery in Maritime Synod, convener of Synod Fund Division Sons of Temperance of North America, Grand Worthy Patriarch Sons of Temperance of New Brunswick and also Grand Worthy Patriarch of the Sons of Temperance of P. E. I. Field Secretary N.B. Branch Dominion Temperance Alliance, Secretary P. E. I. Temperance Alliance, Secretary P. E. I. Temperance Federation, President of Social Service Council, P. E. I. Is serving on executive P. E. I. Auxiliary of Canadian Branch, British and Foreign Bible Society.



HON. W. J. P. McMILLAN
M.D., C.M., F.A.C.S., L.M.C.C., L.L.D.

Former Prime Minister Prince Edward Island; first elected to P.E.I. Legislature 1923, appointed leader Conservative Party 1933, and sworn in as Premier Oct. 4, 1933. Provincial Treasurer and Minister of Education and Health. Chief of staff, Charlottetown Hospital. Clubs: Knights of Columbus; Rotary, Charlottetown. Societies: Red Cross, president; Children's Aid, president; Anti-T.B.C. Association, vice-president, Boy Scouts. Roman Catholic. Appointed Minister without portfolio 1923; re-elected general elections 1927-31. Appointed Minister of Education and Public Health, in previous Government, 1931. Upon death of Hon. J. D. Stewart selected leader.



RT. REV. J. A. O'SULLIVAN
Bishop of Charlottetown
7th Bishop of the Diocese of Charlottetown since its establishment in 1829. Bishop O'Sullivan was born in Hamilton, Ontario, on the 29th November, 1866. Educated in St. Mary's School, Hamilton, and St. Jerome's College, Kitchener, graduating in 1908. Attended the Grand Seminary, Montreal until 1911 when he was ordained to the priesthood, August 5th, 1911. His first appointment was as curate to St. Mary's Cathedral, Hamilton, where he became rector in 1921, and chancellor of Hamilton Diocese. In 1925 was appointed Rector of St. Augustine's Seminary, Toronto, which position he held until his appointment to the See of Charlottetown, 1931. Consecrated in St. Mary's Cathedral, Hamilton, May 7th, 1931 and came to Charlottetown, May 19th of that year.
