**Trainmen's Union Prepares To Join Canadian Labor Congress**

OTTAWA (CP) — Canada's biggest independent rail union — the Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen — is preparing to enter the Canadian Labor Congress.

The trainmen have been taking an unpublished poll of their 111 Canadian lodges — for about a month, and informants said Monday the vote is running heavily in favor of affiliation with the 1,000,000-member congress.

The brotherhood, one of the most potent of railway unions, has some 22,000 members in Canada.

In entering the CLC, it would be losing overboard more than a half century of traditional independence. However, it would be following the same course as the Brotherhood of Locomotive Firemen and Enginemen, which dispensed with a similar long history of no alliances by joining the congress last year.

**OBTAINED GO-AHEAD**

The trainmen have obtained the go-ahead for CLC entry from the congress leadership. All they need now is a majority of their local lodges voting for affiliation.

Up to Monday, officials said, returns received here showed a current vote of 49 lodges for affiliation and five against. A majority was expected in the next fortnight or so.

**Easterly Winds Aid Shipping In Western Nfld.**

CORNER BROOK, Nfld. (CP) — Easterly winds loosened Arctic ice in the St. Lawrence Gulf during the weekend, shifting the western Newfoundland shipping season into high gear after a 2½-month blockade.

Two freighters arrived in Corner Brook to load newsprint Sunday escorted by the icebreaker N.B. McLean. The transport departed Saturday led a third freighter loaded with newsprint through the ice field.

Stevadores began loading newsprint rolls aboard the Margaret Bowater and the Sarah Bowater shortly after the vessels moored at the wharf. The Fort Avalon sailed for Philadelphia with 2,400 tons of newsprint.

The Margaret and the Sarah had waited in Port aux Basques, Nfld., for conditions to clear. The Fort Avalon had been in port here since April 5 waiting to sail.

Three more ships are scheduled to arrive here Tuesday. They are the lake boats Kingdoc and Gandoc and the Swedish freighter Axel Gorthon. The lakeboats are carrying general cargo for discharge here while the freighter is to pick up a pulpwood cargo for the United Kingdom.

**International Status Of Tangier Will End April 30**

TANGIER, Morocco (Reuters) — The British post office in what used to be the international zone here is closing down at midnight on April 30.

All British postage stamps not sold by then will be destroyed. The stamps are similar to those used in Britain and in the same values, but are overprinted with the word "Tangier."

Moroccan post office officials will take over the British post office on May 1 and the new postage stamps on sale will bear a photograph of Sultan Mohammed V.

**END OF INTERNATIONALISM**

The step follows abrogation of the international statute of Tangier.

The British post office here celebrated its centenary April 1 this year. It is a relic of the time when Morocco had no post office services of its own and when each interested nation established its own postal services for political or business reasons.

As a result, at the beginning of this century there was in Tangier the Mission San Gabriel, is expected to sail shortly. The vessel has been berthed at Port Harmon since April 22.

and several other towns in Morocco a British post office, a Spanish one, a French one and a German one.

The British post office in Tangier opened April 1, 1857, a few months after Queen Victoria had signed a treaty of trade and friendship with the sultan of Morocco.

**COLLECTOR'S ITEMS**

Before this post office was opened, letters for Tangier had to be sent to Gibraltar and thence across the straits by boats whose captains found someone in Tangier to distribute them.

Hundreds of collectors, believing stamps bearing the cancellation mark of the last day will be valuable, are sending in envelopes to be mailed April 30. Post office employees are expecting to do record business on the last day.

Moroccan nationalists, while working for the independence of their country, made considerable use of the British post office for their foreign correspondence. At a time when they feared the possibility of French censorship, the British post office offered them unique security. Paradoxically, the very independence which this security helped to further now is the cause of the disappearance of the service.

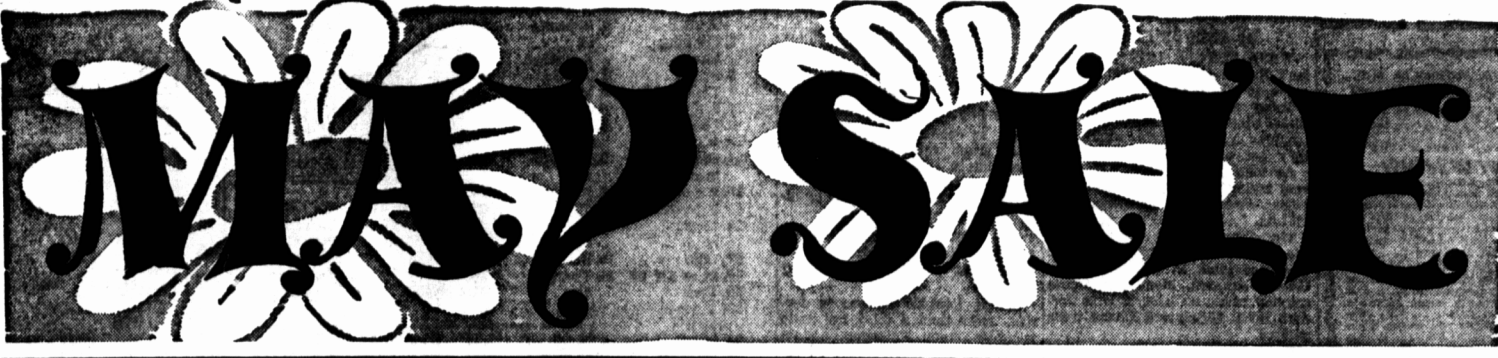

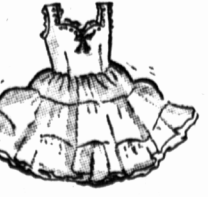
