NEW YORK (AP) — The stock market finally stopped sliding downward Tuesday—but it didn't bounce very high.
Steels were about the strongest group. Some electronics did well. Motorola added another 7, closing at 156 compared with its 1959 low of 57 1/2.
The Associated Press average of 60 stocks ended with a gain of 50 cents at 218.90.
Volume declined to 3,570,000 shares.
U.S. Steel rose 2 1/2 to 94 1/2 and Lukens climbed 3/4 to 84.
Among the Canadian issues, Aluminum Ltd. and International Nickel both gained 1/2 and Canadian Pacific and Dome Mines were up 1/4. Distillers Seagrams lost 1/4. Hudson Bay Mining 1/2 and Granby Mining dropped 1/4.
American Stock Exchange prices were mostly higher on volume of 1,360,000 shares.
On the Canadian list, Scurry Rainbow Oil and Canadian Marconi, both jumped 1/4 and Jupiter Oils and Prestige East Dome 1/4. Shawinigan lost 1/4.

Up 1/2 in the section were Brown at 94, and Consolidated at 38. Quarter-point gainers were Abitibi at 38 and Price Brothers at 43 1/2.
Steels made a partial recovery.

TORONTO

TORONTO (CP) — The stock market, for the second day in a row, continued to ramble about a lower level.
Base metals led index losses, falling off more than a point. Golds were off a half-point as was western oils. Industrials were off one-quarter point, a big difference from Monday when the industrial index loss was nearly five points. But more winners among the industrials today brought the index back up.
Senior mines were solidly lower

but declines were fractional. Only a few of the issues traded made any gains.
Several of the lower-priced issues were off in a 10-20 cent range with Preston East Dome leading the way with a 30-cent drop to \$5.35.
Western oils, for the second straight day, were quiet and most issues traded showed moderate losses, usually 15 to 20 cents among the lower priced issues and fractions in the senior oils.
Index losses: golds .45 at 85.99; base metals 1.05 at 166.96; and western oils .42 at 90.23.
