Lemon-Shrimp Salad Platter: Use flake 1 lb. can salmon, bones, and skin removed. Add 1 c. thin-sliced celery, 1 c. sweet French dressing, and 1/2 c. cream dressing.
Mix with fork; add salt and pepper to taste. Blend with mayonnaise. Chill.
Spoon in center of large platter.

Top with mayonnaise and pitted ripe olives.
Ring with thin slices cucumber, alternating with lettuce nests filled with shrimp and egg salad.
My Aunt Mabel of Windham County, Connecticut, was famous for her unusual special version of strawberry shortcake.

Aunt Mabel's 4 - Layer Shortcake: Sift together 4 c. pre-sifted enriched flour, 3/4 c. sugar, 1 tsp. salt and 3 tsp. double-acting baking powder. With pastry blender chop in 1/2 c. butter.

Beat 2 eggs lightly; add 1 c. milk; stir in flour. Batter will be very thick.
Spread in 2 oiled (9") layer cake pans. Bake 25 min. in hot oven, 400 degrees F. Cool five min.

Split layers horizontally, making four. Spread with room-soft butter. Put together and top with 3 pts. prepared fresh strawberries and juice.

Pass heavy cream in pitcher, or garnish with whipped cream if you must. Serve at once.
To prepare strawberries: Wash 3 pts. fresh strawberries. Drain; remove hulls. Crush berries slightly. Stir in 1/4 c. sugar. Keep warm for an hour to create "plenty of juice," but do not cook.

TRICK OF THE CHEF

Beat 1/2 tsp. curry powder into French dressing for salmon-shrimp salad.
