when the king of clubs was opened. Declarer was able to take advantage of the club suit block by giving up a heart to East, and thus scored three spades, four hearts, and two diamonds. What happened to the four heart bidders depend on how good or bad the defense was. The king of clubs was opened. When this held, a club continuation went to East's ace and a diamond was returned. Declarer won and cashed the A-K of hearts and A-K-Q of spades, discarding a club. Then, after ruffing a diamond in dummy, only a trump trick was lost and the contract was made. But the four-heart bidders who encountered the best defense went down two tricks. Where East was smart enough to overtake the club king with the ace and return a club, the South players came to an unhappy end. It was not difficult then for West to deduce that East had started with A-5 alone. So after winning the jack of clubs and cashing the queen, West returned a fourth club to dummy's nine. East ruffed with the jack and it did not matter what declarer now did. South had to lose two trump tricks and go down two. The East players who were too lazy to reach for the ace of clubs on the opening lead paid a heavy penalty. Though they could hardly have failed to be aware West had additional club strength besides taking, they failed to take advantage of it.

TV Quiz Show Is Cancelled

NEW YORK (AP) — P. Lorillard Company announced Friday it has cancelled sponsorship of the television quiz show, The \$64,000 Challenge. A former contestant said last week he was given answers in advance, a charge denied by program officials. The show's producer said, The cancellation does not concern any accusation made against the show. It was the second quiz show to be cancelled recently. The popular show, Datto, was dropped with a minimum of explanation by the Colgate - Palmolive Company and by two networks carrying it, CBS and NBC. Later, disclosure of complaints to the Federal Communication Commission and to the Manhattan district attorney's office that Datto was rigged touched off an investigation of a number of programs. District Attorney Frank S. Hogan said Friday he is laying all the evidence he has gathered before a grand jury but cautioned against any implication he had found wrongdoing.
