The bidding:

East South West North Pass 2NT Pass 3NT

Opening lead—five of hearts. In nearly every case when the declarer takes a finesse, he hopes to win the finesse, but there are some occasions when he earnestly hopes the finesse will lose. One such example is this situation. South is playing three notrump and West leads a heart. Declarer wins the king with the ace and decides that the best way to handle the hand is to lead a low diamond and finesse the jack.

PARIS (Reuters)—A new wave of strikes throughout France Monday following the collapse Sunday night of talks to settle a 240,000 striking coal miners' dispute.

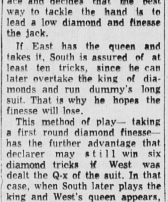
Prime Minister Poincaré, on his way to the Elvée Palace to discuss the situation with President de Gaulle, told reporters the miners' attitude is "intolerable."
