CONTRACT BRIDGE

North dealer. Neither side vulnerable. NORTH: ♠KJ4, ♥A8, ♦A10962, ♣993. WEST: ♠9752, ♥QJ652, ♦K43, ♣A6. EAST: ♠10863, ♥A5, ♦K43, ♣8752. SOUTH: ♠AQ, ♥10972, ♦QJ5, ♣KJ104.

The ace and not make the mistake of playing the eight from dummy. If the heart is ducked East wins, returns a heart, and the contract is irretrievably lost.

Opening lead—five of hearts. A question frequently asked is: What is the most important single facility required to become a good bridge player? And the answer is that the trait most needed to play the game well is the ability to avoid error.

Thus, if South gets to his hand with a spade in finesse the queen of diamonds, East takes the king, cashes the heart king, and puts West in with a club to defeat the contract two tricks.

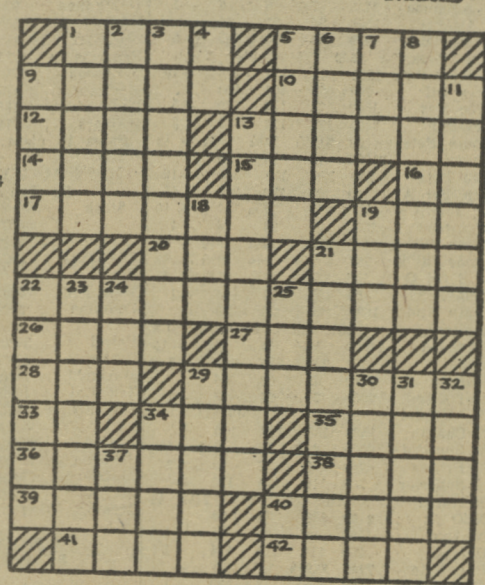

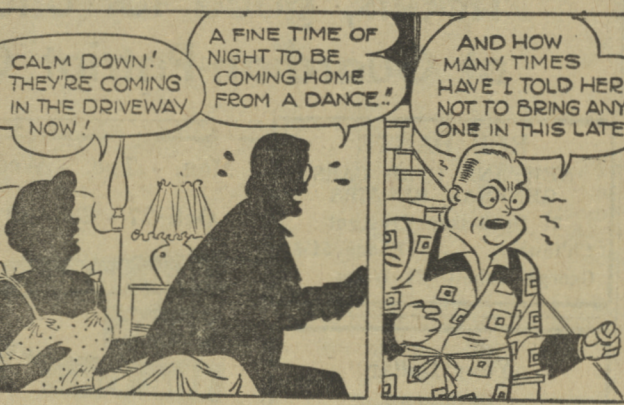

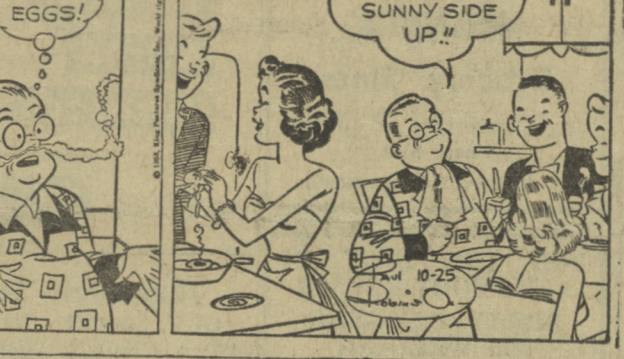
DAILY CRYPTOQUOTE

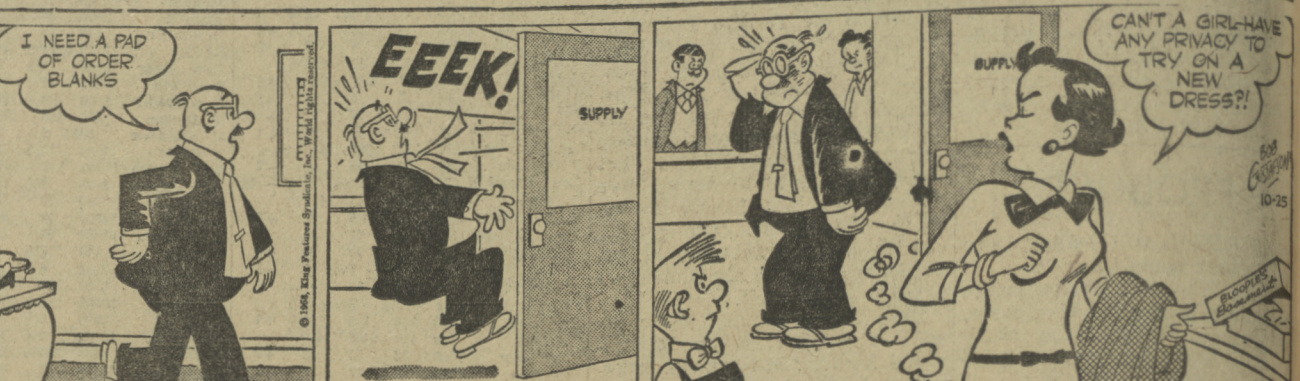

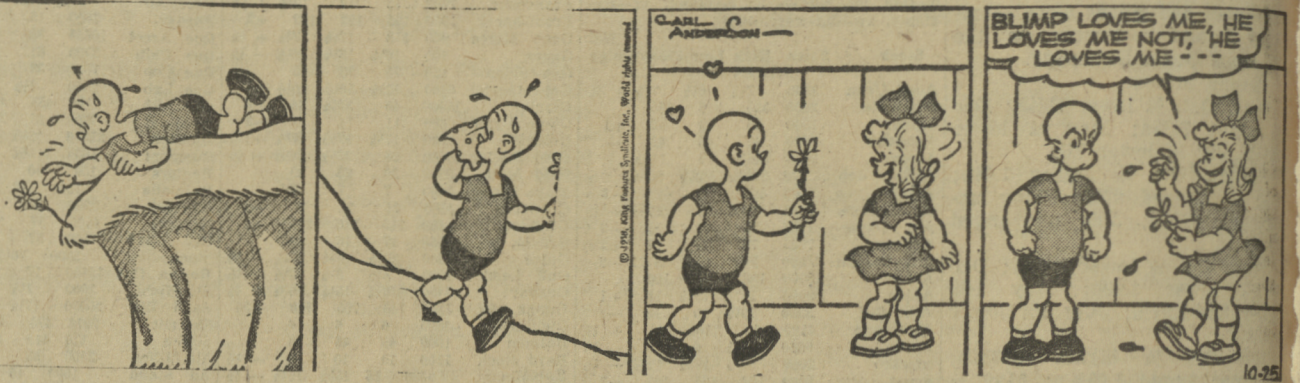
