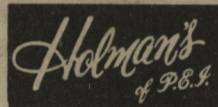

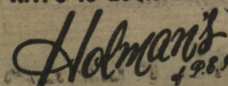

Nominations and applications should be sent to Professor James MacDougall, Chairperson, Dean of Science Search Committee, c/o Department of Mathematics and Computer Science, University of P.E.I.

Nominators must have the consent of their nominees. All applicants must provide a current **curriculum vitae** and arrange for three letters of reference to be sent to the chairperson of the Search Committee.

All candidates must be prepared to deliver a public talk on their views of the role of Dean of Science at UPEI in terms of the duties and responsibilities of Deans outlined in the **Faculty Handbook**. The search is restricted to persons presently employed by the University.
