### Shepherds In Cyprus Live In Fear

NICOSIA (AP) — The scene seemed straight from the Bible — a gaunt old man with a leather pouch on his back, grazing his sheep on a hillside in a Cyprus sun.  
They found his body next day, crumpled in the bottom of a well, with two bullet holes in his forehead.  
Shepherds in Cyprus watch their flocks in fear, and the once peaceful profession has become one of the most dangerous jobs on the troubled island.  
Twenty-one shepherds have been wounded or killed since near-civil war erupted between Greek and Turkish — Cypriots. Dozens more have been fired at. At least 10 have vanished or been kidnapped.  
"To find grazing for the sheep and goats, we have to go a long way from the villages, and there is no one out there to protect us," explained Hassan Hussein, a 30-year-old shepherd from the Turkish village of Hamli Mandres. "I never know when I go out in the morning if I will ever get home again."  
**CHASED BY GREEKS**  
"Forty-five days ago I was with my sheep over there," he said, pointing beyond the barren, dust-colored hills where nothing grows. "I heard shouts and stood up and there were four Greeks running toward me. They fired their guns and I ran — I ran so fast I left my boots behind. I hid in a dry river-bed."  
Every year when the sun-seared fields dry up, the island's shepherds take their flocks to the rich green foothills of the mountains. This year the move means crossing enemy territory, for Greeks and Turks alike, and many shepherds fear their animals will die on the sparse lowland grazing.  
"I am 77 years old and I have been a shepherd all my life, and this is the first year I can remember when I wouldn't take the sheep to the hills," said Panayis Yanni, a bulking Greek villager from Mia Miles "Apple Tree."  
"I am not afraid, but my wife is, and she doesn't want me to go to the fields at all."

### Argument Presented For Bank Charter

OTTAWA (CP) — Premier Bennett told the Senate banking committee today there are compelling geographic, economic and social reasons for issuing a charter for the Bank of British Columbia.  
He told senators Vancouver is two-thirds of a continent away from the financial centres of Toronto and Montreal where four of the head offices of National banks are located.  
The fifth such bank has its head office in Halifax "which is closer to London, England, or Paris, France, than Vancouver B.C."  
"I am sure eastern Canadian would not be fully satisfied with services provided from branches and regional offices subject to distant head office approval," said Mr. Bennett.
