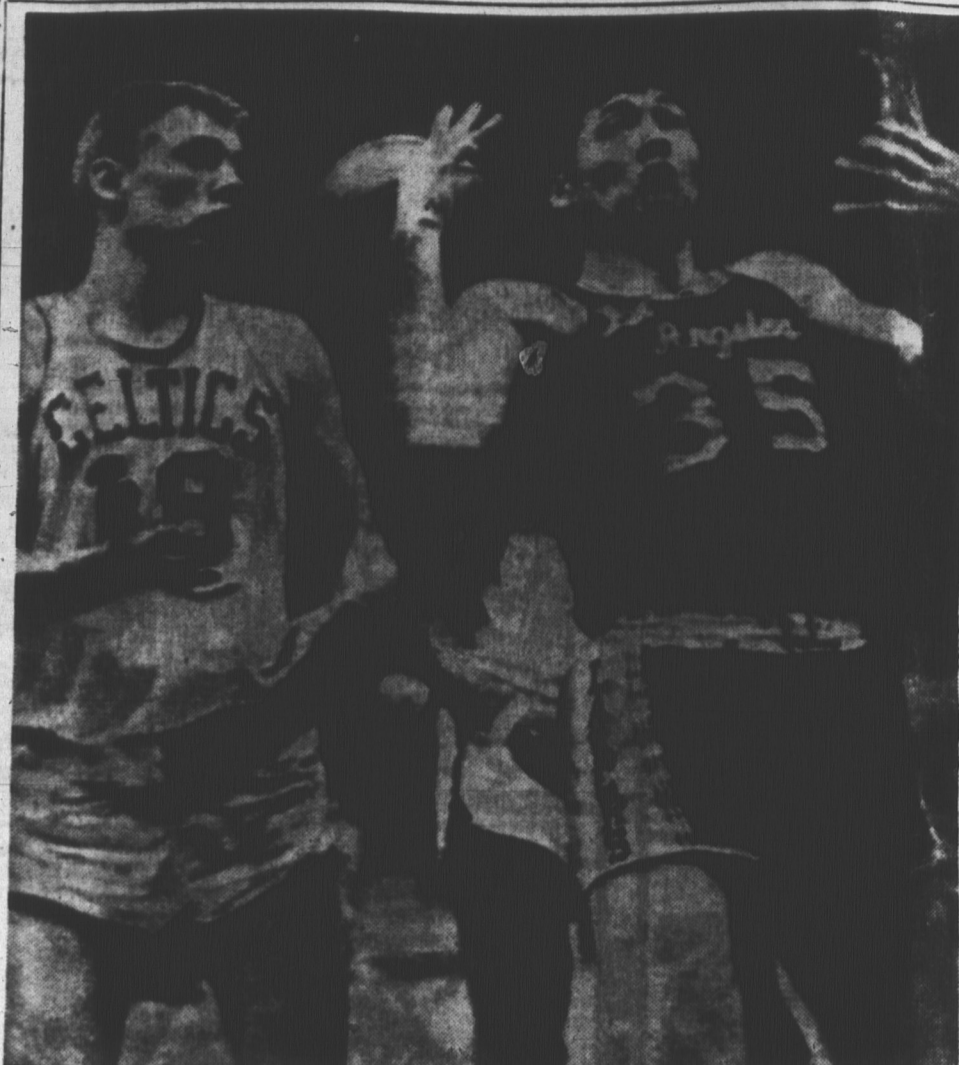

National Coach MacLeod Makes Defensive Change

By WALTER KREVENCHUK WINNIPEG (CP) - Coach Jackie MacLeod spotted some weaknesses but injections of fresh talent appear to have produced a strong Canadian national hockey team for the world championships in Ljubljana, Yugoslavia, March 3-13.

The club swept to 26 victories and four draws in its first 30 exhibition games, beat Russia for the first time in 18 meetings, collected five of a possible eight points from Czechoslovakia and defeated Sweden 8-3.

But while this was being done, MacLeod noticed that his defence was "making too many bad mistakes... getting worse instead of better" and that his forwards needed "to tighten up on checking and positional play."

The defects have forced MacLeod to make adjustments before the team leaves Feb. 21 for Europe and a five-game exhibition warmup prior to the world tournament.

But he still feels the Canadians are the only team with a hope of dethroning the highly-disciplined Russians. All it would take to bring Canada its first world title since 1961 is a titanic effort.

"CAN BEAT THEM" "If three or four players come up with real big games and the rest play as well as they can, we can beat them."

MacLeod found out his young club had limitations after 16 games without a defeat. Then Russia's national team marched into the country in December and promptly spanked the nationals 4-0 and 5-5.

"We skated with them but we weren't scoring enough goals, the defence wasn't clearing the puck and they were beating us in the corners."

The Canadians bested the Soviets in only one category - "we got 90 per cent of the faceoffs."

The team's advisers - Rev. David Bauer and Gordon Hughes, Canadian Amateur Hockey Association secretary-treasurer from Melville, Sask., - decided the club's young players needed the steady hand of experience on the ice.

They convinced MacLeod, 35-year-old native of Swift Current, Sask., who was the leading scorer on three world championship clubs, he was the man for the job.

With the boss beside them, the players responded with a convincing 6-1 verdict over Russia in Victoria. But the defending world champions bounced back to complete a six-game set with five victories.

Nineteen goals by the Soviet power play forced MacLeod to seek a remedy for his defence ills.

Paul Conlin, veteran of the first national team assembled in 1963 by Father Bauer, will lose his job on the blueline and switch to a forward position.

Lorne Davis, a 35-year-old veteran of 113 National Hockey League games, was called in from the senior Regina Caps to bolster the defence. "He doesn't give the puck away," MacLeod said.

Davis will replace George Faulkner, 31-year-old Newfoundland-lander, who was giving the puck away. Faulkner will likely move to forward.

Seth Martin, 32, twice chosen the outstanding goaltender in world tournaments, will journey from the senior Roseland Warriors to join rookie Wayne Stephensen and national veteran Ken Broderick.

MacLeod sees his top line as Roger Bourbonnais and Marshall Johnston - national team originals whom he rates as the club's "most consistent" players - and Ray Cadieux, another member of the 1963 unit. Bourbonnais paced the team in exhibition goals with 21 and first in points with 54.

Conlin will move next to Fran Husek, a rookie who scored 194 goals in two Saskatchewan Junior Hockey League seasons, and MacLeod Husek was second in exhibition goals with 21 and first in points with 54.

Third-line prospects are Billy MacMillan, a native of Charlottetown, Rick McCann, 21-year-old centre from Hamilton, Faulkner, Morris Mott, the most gentlemanly player in the SJHL last season, and Ted Narver, SJHL scoring champion three years ago.

The modified defence will include Gary Begg, Barry MacKenzie, Terry O'Malley, all 1963 originals, former SJHL all-star Harvey Schmidt and Davis.

Trouble of the kind facing MacLeod is nothing new for Canada's national team.

MOVED FROM B.C. Able to reward volunteers only with university tuition fees and a basic expense account, the CAHA has had trouble attracting top players.
