Yarmouth Textile Firm Now Is Handling More Business

YARMOUTH, N.S. (CP)—Two years ago Thistle Knitwear Company Limited had trouble making ends meet. Now it does \$750,000 worth of business a year.

The company is attempting to open export markets with trial shipments to South Africa, British West Indies and Holland. Company Director Leland G. Trask said his firm underwent a \$40,000 expansion this year and a \$300,000 expansion in 1957.

"Whether there is any expansion in 1959 depends on the success of our export shipments," he said.

HAD TRANSPORT TROUBLES
Two years ago the company was situated in a building outside the town limits. It was experiencing difficulty getting its labor force to and from the plant. It was also at the point where it required a additional banking. There didn't seem to be any.

Then a group of local businessmen took control and began putting the industry on its feet again. The mill was moved into the town, taking over an eight-year-old \$200,000 building vacated by the federal Unemployment Insurance Commission. Now the company uses 3,600 square feet of floor space in the three-story building.

Production in the mill is confined to sweaters, mostly for women, with a few children's styles. Working two shifts, 75 employees produce 1,000 sweaters a day. The annual payroll amounts to \$150,000.

Raw material comes from Ontario. No wool is used, only synthetic materials—nylon, orlon and banlon.

USE NO WOOL
"We have gone out of wool altogether," said Mr. Trask. "We find that it does not have the potential sale value of the synthetics."

New machinery installed in the plant produces two types of knitting—inter-lock and full-fashion. The inter-lock machine is German-made. It was installed this year and the company brought an instructor from New York to train local employees in its use.

Until local shareholders took over the business all dying for the mill was done in Montreal. The company installed its own dyeing plant and now does the work itself.

All products of the mill are shipped by air to avoid high freight costs. Company officials say air transport is cheaper.
