Record Of Costs To Be Kept Of Political Broadcast Time

OTTAWA (CP)—For the first time in federal election history, a record is to be kept of just how much various parties pay for their political broadcast time.

Radio and television stations across Canada will be getting a form to fill in for the purpose, it was learned here. The form will provide a record of how

much was purchased on behalf of any political party or candidate and how much it cost.

Broadcasting regulations require stations to keep records of paid political broadcasts. But the direct recording of cost for such air time is a new twist. Questionnaire forms for the broadcasting stations will be distributed by the Board of Broadcast Governors. Results of the survey will be turned over to a special committee set up by the government last year to look into election spending.

SEIZED OPPORTUNITY
Impetus for the reporting plan came from the committee, charged with finding out where the campaign dollar goes and possible ways of putting a limit on such spending. It was reported that the committee saw "a golden opportunity" open up when Prime Minister Pearson announced the Nov. 8 federal election.

The committee has been paying particular attention to the cost of political campaigning on the airwaves, cited by politicians as one of their big financial outlays, particularly since the advent of television.

The BBG, regulatory body in the broadcasting field, in the past has been able to look at station records and find out how much political time a station sold during an election campaign.

By using the station's rate card, setting out costs for persons seeking to purchase air time, the BBG could get a rough idea of any station's revenues from political broadcasts.

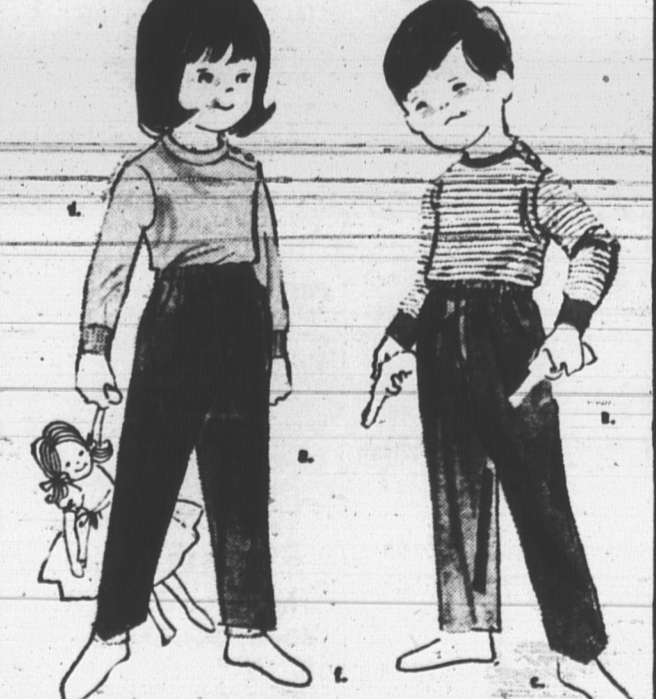
