Hors d'Oeuvres Variées Are Good, Inexpensive

"Is it really more economical to have three courses at a family dinner?" a young homemaker asked the Chef recently at a party of all places!

"It is often much easier on the budget to do this, Madame," he answered, "especially if the first course is composed of less expensive foods or oddments of food."

EASY TO PREPARE
"French homemakers often serve what they call hors d'oeuvres variées which are inexpensive, easy to prepare, and look really glamorous when attractively arranged and garnished. At their best they might be classed as gourmet foods of the provincial type."

"Arrange a selection in glass dishes of the same size and parade them down a tray to make a smart appearance. When chilled, they can be served with pride."

HORS D'OEUVRES VARIÉES
1. Season boiled white beans with French dressing, a dusting of curry powder and minced parsley.

2. Remove cellulose casing from thin slices of cervelat or dry sausage; over-lap slices for service.

3. To potato salad made with 1 qt. hot cubed potatoes, add 3 tsp. not-sweet French dressing mixed with ½ tsp. onion salt, 4 drops bottled garlic juice and 1 tsp. parsley flakes. Blend with mayonnaise; chill.

4. To 2 c. cubed beef and 1 c. diced celery, add ¼ tsp. dry mustard dissolved in 1-3 c. not-sweet French dressing. Chill.

Garnish with chopped chives or green onions.

"For a party include, if you like, shrimp marinated in not-sweet French dressing; chilled sardines with lemon wedges, and quartered, stuffed hard-boiled eggs."

TOMORROW'S DINNER
Hors d'oeuvres variées, baked bean casserole, sliced-hot smoked tongue, hot garlic bread, fruit compote pie, coffee, tea, milk.

Measurements are level; recipes for 4 to 6.

Baked bean casserole: Butter a 2-qt. shallow baking dish or casserole. To contents of 1 (46 oz.) can baked beans, add 4 tsp. melted butter or savory fat containing 2 minced, medium green small onions, sautéed until limp. Transfer to casserole. Cover with 1½ c. well-drained, slightly broken-up, solid-pack canned tomatoes. Dust with seasoned salt and ½ c. grated sharp Cheddar cheese.

Scald 6 thin slices bacon with boiling water; drain. Arrange on top. Slow-bake 45 min. in mod.

oven, 350 degrees F., or until bacon is brown and crisp.

TRICK OF THE CHEF
When preparing garlic bread, instead of using crushed fresh garlic, spread slices lightly with room-soft butter creamed with 3 or 4 drops liquid garlic.
