New York Stocks

NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market jumped ahead Friday under strong leadership and pushed to within a shade of a record high mark.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks was up \$1.70 cents, greatest rise in four months, and closed at \$176.30, only a dime under the record high scored two weeks ago.

Motors, oils and railroads provided good leadership for the bounce ahead, and also up were most steels, radio televisions, chemicals, coppers, airlines and utilities.

General Motors with a record production week hit a new high and closed at 129 1/2.

The rise of \$1.70 in the AP average of 60 stocks was accompanied by a boost of \$2.40 in the industrial component, a hike of \$1.70 in the rails and a gain of 10 cents in the utilities component at a new high since 1931 of \$75.30.

Canadian issues were mostly higher. Canadian Pacific added 1/4. International Nickel and Hiram Walker were both ahead 1/4 and McIntyre was up 1/4. Dome Mines slipped 1/4.

On the American stock exchange Royalite Oil was ahead 1/4. Lake Shore increased 1/4.
