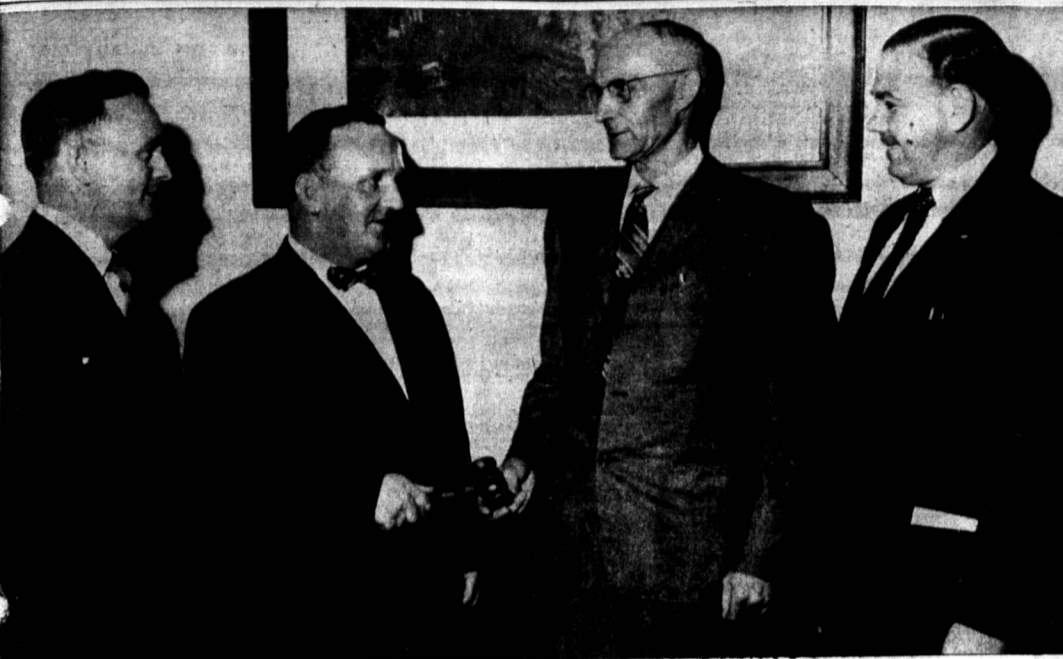

## CHILDREN STUNNED

The jet crashed in La Tuna Canyon to the east. The school ground, sheets of flame spurted horizontally as the \$2,000,000 sky giant, being tested for delivery to Continental Airlines, plunged in.

## West Germans Are Warned Of Dangers If They Bolt NATO

BONN, Germany (AP) — Foreign Minister Heinrich von Brentano solemnly warned the West Germans Thursday that they will risk "deadly dangers" if they bolt the North Atlantic Alliance to pursue an independent policy.

## BOTH BLOCS FRAIL

Chairman Erich Ollenhauer of the socialists replied that the Middle East and Hungarian crises had demonstrated the fragility of both the Atlantic Alliance and the Soviet military bloc.
