SPACE TWINS MAY LAND TODAY

Million Mile Travel Mark Exceeded By Nikolayev

MOSCOW—Russia's space twins went to sleep in orbit Monday night after one of them had logged more than 1,000,000 miles.

There were indications that one or both might land today.

A Soviet source told the Associated Press something interesting would happen Tuesday afternoon but refused to elaborate. However, it is about that time both astronauts might be in position over the Soviet Union for a landing.

The Soviet news agency said Maj. Andrian Nikolayev, launched in his spaceship Vostok III Saturday, had flown 1,000,000 miles in 40 orbits by 4 p.m. ADT.

By the same time, Lt.-Col. Pavel Popovich, launched in Vostok IV Sunday, had hurried 825,000 miles in 24 orbits.

In the Crystal City area, 120 miles southwest of Winnipeg, at least five inches of rain fell in less than an hour Friday. Hail stones which some described as large as golf balls followed, leaving ditches with three feet of water and land coated with ice.

One farmer said his crop loss was 100 per cent.
