'62 CNR Achievements Described Noteworthy

MONTRÉAL (CP) - Canadian National Railways recorded "noteworthy achievements" in ending labor revenues in 1962, President Donald Gordon said.

In a year-end review, Mr. Gordon credited aggressive sales policy, the introduction of new services and the improvement in equipment for the better look.

"Our operating revenues exceeded budgeted figures and CN's deficit is expected to be down from \$48 million in 1961 figure," he said.

Profit returned to a level of nearly four per cent, passenger revenue showed a similar decline - about two per cent - in several years, and revenue from Canadian National Telecommunications reached an all-time high, going up 15 per cent to about \$77,000,000. Total revenue was not significantly changed.

Total operating revenues are expected to show a decline of about four per cent and to exceed slightly the budgeted figure of \$780,000,000, he said.
