H. RICE'S pastorate of the Second Methodist Church in this city, terminates with to-morrow's services. He will leave for his new circuit, Newcastle, N. B., on Wednesday morning next. A LETHAL case named Charles A. Barnes, 33 years of age, escaped from the Provincial Lunatic Asylum, St. John, N. B., a few weeks ago, and was not heard of until Wednesday, when his body was found in Broad's Cove. LATE advices from New Brunswick report that another veterinary surgeon is on the rampage. This fellow's name is Christopher Oulton, and he has distinguished himself by running off with the wife of Mr. James Townsend, of Brooklyn, N. B. ALL the rebellion prisoners have been released from Stony Mountain jail, with the exception of Big Bear and a half-breed who made himself conspicuous during the late rebellion; but it is thought that clemency will be exerted in their behalf ere long. By the last Canada Gazette we learn that Sergt. Major Geo. M. Moore has been appointed Lieutenant of the Charlottetown Engineers vice W. A. Weeks promoted to the Captaincy; also that Sergeant H. M. Davison has been appointed Second Lieutenant (provisionally) of the same Co., vice Alex. Horne, resigned. We are informed that the Novelty, a steam seiner, from Portland, Me., was at Pictou yesterday endeavoring to get a supply of coal. The coal dealers refuse to sell, and have telegraphed the Minister of Marine and Fisheries for instructions. The Novelty is about 300 tons register, and has a patent refrigerator on board, with which it freezes the fish and takes them fresh into New York. MESSRS MEIKLE AND GERRIER, the evangelists, have, after due deliberation, decided to take a hand in the routing of Satan from Prince Edward Island. With this object in view, an immense canvas tent, 500 chairs and a large number of benches were landed at Georgetown yesterday, where the first onslaught is to be made, after which Charlottetown will likely be attended to. THE steamer Worcester arrived from Boston at eleven o'clock this morning, with a general cargo and the following passengers: Mr. Oliver Smith, Mr. Walter Smith, Mrs. Emma Ashton, Misses Hannah Mullin, Maggie Mullin and Amanda Tanner. She will sail on return at six o'clock Monday afternoon. The Merrimack left for this port to-day and is due Tuesday evening. She will leave here again on Thursday evening at six. ONE of the most cowardly assaults that has occurred in this city for some time past, was committed last evening upon a young man named Lawrence Durant, of Hope River. About nine o'clock last evening Durant was walking along Upper Great George Street, and when near the Christian Meeting House noticed two young men who were acting somewhat queerly. He stepped off the sidewalk in order to pass without coming in contact with them, but no sooner had he done so than one of the men elevated a bottle over his head and with an oath brought it down with as much strength as he could command upon Durant's head. The bottle was broken in small pieces, the men walked off without further ceremony, and Durant, whose head had been badly cut, and from which the blood was freely flowing, staggered into the arms of a gentleman on the opposite side of the street. He informed the gentleman of the assault and asked him for assistance in reaching his boarding house, a block or two distant. After the boarding house had been reached, medical assistance was summoned and the police notified of the assault. On examination the wound on the forehead proved to be more serious than was at first suspected, and three stitches were necessary. The policemen were promptly on the scene of the assault, but not a trace of the assailants could be found; and as Durant is a stranger in the city, the cowards will likely go unwhipped of justice.

The City Triumph. Sir,—Once again the Liberals of Charlottetown have suffered defeat, and this time their reverse is severer than any one ever dreamed of, and shows how thoroughly sick the people of this city are of Criticism. Even Mr. Peters, whom he so patronizingly took under his wing, distanced him, and all the cheering and shouting that have been indulged in on behalf of Mr. Morris remind us of Pat at the horse race. Pat was lustily cheering for his favorite horse, which, however, crossed the wire last. "Why, you foolish fellow," said one of the spectators, "what are you cheering that horse for?" "Och! don't you see," replied Pat, "how he drives them all ahead of him?" Rum, bribery, and the thousand little tricks, and subtleties, and artifices, at which the Grits are such adepts, have once more miserably failed, and right and justice have nobly triumphed over might and wrong. A blow, more deadly than a thousand Scott Acts, has been dealt the liquor traffic in Charlottetown; the high moral sentiment of the community has made itself felt in the contest. Electors, with the law of man and the fear of God written in their hearts, have angrily resented the impudent attempt of the deadly hydra to rear its head more boldly than ever in this city, and have taught the liquor interest, as represented by the late "leading" candidate, that it has gone far enough—that its votaries are mistaken in expecting the countenance and support of respectable and sober minded men, and that Criticism, as allied with the rum traffic, is as dead as Julius Caesar. The political bells are tolling to-day for the funeral of Criticism in Charlottetown. Let them ring a merrier peal, for they "ring out the false, and ring in the true." Criticism is dead.
