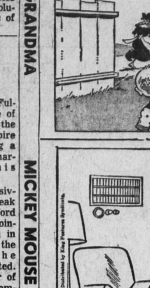
Wartime Hero Dies At Sydney

ground. The chances are that North has five cards in each suit as well as a sprinkling of high cards. It would be wrong to pass and let the opponents make their probable part score when there is an excellent chance that your side can make one instead.
2. Two spades. When you are in the balancing seat—that is, when the auction would be over if you pass—your own suit makes bids that would otherwise be dangerous. Thus, with this hand you would be dangerous to overcall East's heart bid with a spade that is to overcall. We would want to bid two with two spades.
The reason now that the opponents have stopped bidding is that you know partner has a strong hand, card values and relatively few hearts. This increases the chances of North's having some support or some other long suit. You have to battle for the part score when the opponents show limited values.
3. Double it. It is completely here, also, though it is a little risky. The risk is worthwhile because you can afford to let the opponents walk off with a part score when there's a reasonable prospect of your side making one. Part scores have much greater value than is generally realized, and letting the opponents steal them from you means a loss of perhaps 300 points each time it happens.
4. Pass. Of course, there's a limit to how far to go when you're in the protective seat. Balancing has to be sensible—both in respect of your own safety. It would be dangerous to double with this hand—partner might respond with a diamond—and equally dangerous to branch out into clubs with such a shabby suit. The pass is a very easy work out best, since it leaves a reasonable chance that two hearts will be defeated.
