

PETITION TO THE PRIME MINISTER

"We must not permit ourselves to be lulled into the fantasy that nuclear explosions are simply big bangs, or that there is some distinction between a nuclear explosive capable of peaceful uses and for non-peaceful uses."

Nuclear reactors are deadly. Yet the Canadian government is investing billions in the Candu industry. And no one seems to be complaining.

Therefore we urge you to read and consider the following petition, then take it and a list of names and addresses (on a separate sheet of paper) to the Cadre office dropbox in the basement of Memorial. Of course, if you don't care, don't bother. A nuclear holocaust should be a lot of fun to die in.

THE UNDERSIGNED is a Canadian who is NOT COMPLACENT.....

I DEPLORE: - The selling of CANDU nuclear reactors to other nations, thus proliferating the means to produce nuclear weapons, increasing the danger of atomic accidents and sabotage, harming our national economy by large scale long-term loans which may not be repaid;

-The increasing danger of nuclear warfare, as the technological arms race threatens to make control impossible and more nat-

ions (e.g. India recently - with Canada's help) join the nuclear club;

-Canada's vast investment in nuclear power plants (\$50 billion by the year 2000 -predicted in "An Energy Policy for Canada") and the lack of public and parliamentary discussion about this use of public funds;

-The legacy of radioactive waste for future generations.

THEREFORE I PETITION THAT:

1. Our government call a halt to selling nuclear reactors;
2. Our government accelerate research and development into renewable, non-polluting sources of energy, such as solar, wind, geothermal power, methane from wastes, etc.;
3. Our government use all its influence toward the abolition of all nuclear weapons and the phased reduction of all other armaments through United Nations action at the proposed World Disarmament Conference.
