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Takes Issue With Postmaster General

OTTAWA, June 30 —(Special)— In the closing hours of the House of Commons, W. Chester S. McLure Conservative member for Queen's charged on the debate on post office estimates that Postmaster General Rinfret had made untrue and belittling statements about him in a speech delivered in Charlottetown.

He called the attention of the House to the fact that "was the first one to bring to his attention that the post office bill increasing postal rates on newspapers was rotten from start to finish" Mr. McLure stated the record of House of Commons debates would prove whether or not he had worked to the best of his ability to have the postal rates on daily newspapers reduced to reasonable amounts.

He also asked the Minister "so far as postal matters are concerned; the Province of Prince Edward Island does not have the rights extended to other provinces," Mr. McLure added. "For instance we are attached to the province of New Brunswick, I cannot understand why, because members of the cabinet should know the terms of Confederation. Had the Minister will look up those terms, he will find that Prince Edward Island is to be treated the same so far as the post office department is concerned as any other province in Canada."

"Mr. McLure further protested that injustice was being done the letter-carriers he said, were very by the recent extension of their walks and the imposition of heavier loads of mail. Charlottetown letter-carriers he said, were very reasonable and had merely asked for time and a half or overtime work. This request had been turned down by the department, he charged.

In conclusion, Mr. McLure said he was glad that the Postmaster-General had visited Charlottetown during the recent by-election because his influence was such that the Conservative candidate was elected quite easily.

He further reminded the House that there were more enlistments per capita in both world wars from the Prince Edward Island constituency of Queen's than any other riding in Canada. On this account, during the passing of estimates for the Veterans' Affairs Department, he said there is particular interest in Queen's in the question of unemployable veterans. Mr. McLure intimated that the Veterans Affairs Department seemed at times to be reluctant to class a badly-disabled man as "unemployable." He felt there should be more "practical com-
