Pro-British Business Man Is Killed By Gunmen In Nicosia

NICOSIA, Cyprus (AP) — Bullets in the back and head killed Edgar Charles Bonnici, a young pro-British business man, before the eyes of his fiancée as they walked to lunch Wednesday.
Bonnici, a 24-year-old Maltese, fell dead on crowded Hippocrates Street—known as "bloody alley" for past killings there by Greek Cypriot gunmen — as he groped vainly for a shoulder-holstered revolver he carried as a volunteer police constable.
His fiancée, Drossoula Demet-Mass, some years ago, and Mr. Elmer Ladner, also from Massachusetts.

riades, 22, dropped beside the body weeping, and vowed vengeance.
"I know who did it," she said.
A Greek Cypriot herself, employed as a clerk in the Cyprus Broadcasting Service, she said she was sure the killer was a member of EOKA, the Greek Cypriot underground that is fighting for union of this British island colony with Greece.
ATTACKER "UNKNOWN"
Police investigators, however, expressed doubt that Miss Demetriades knew the killer. They questioned her and sent her home. A British report said the eight-shot attack, in which four bullets found their mark, was made by "an unknown assailant or assailants."
British authorities reacted by imposing a curfew on the Greek quarter of Nicosia's walled inner city and on all Greek-owned cafes, cabarets and other places of entertainment in this capital and its suburbs. Troops cordoned off the inner city.
Bonnici managed the clothing department of Spinneys department store, Nicosia's largest. He was widely known for his anti-extremist and pro-British views.
