Plan Pulp Mill North Of Edmonton

EDMONTON (CP)—Executives of two U.S. and Canadian firms arrived here Tuesday to lay the groundwork for a \$30,000,000 pulp mill development in the Edison area, 130 miles west of Edmonton.

The group is composed of representatives of the St. Regis Paper Co., of New York, North Canadian Oils Ltd., of Calgary, and its subsidiary, North Western Pulp and Paper Co. North Western has an agreement with the Alberta government for long-term, timber-cutting rights on more than 4,000 square miles.

The plant will be designed to provide for future expansion but the initial plans include a unit having a daily capacity of 300 tons of bleached sulphate pulp.

—The world would be a much different place, if all the chemical developments of the past fifty years had not taken place, Mr. Douglas Walkington of Canadian Industries Limited said yesterday in an extremely interesting talk to the Summerside Rotary Club at their regular weekly meeting at Howards Restaurant, Rotarian president J. C. (Bud) Mountain, presided.

"Chemistry and You" was the title of Mr. Walkington's address in which he stressed that the products of chemistry are not understood and with the industry moving ahead so rapidly, even those in the business, have difficulty in keeping up, as the last 15 years has seen an amazing jump forward in this field.

Mr. Walkington stated that because there are at least twenty different kinds of plastics, each with their own distinctive properties, they must be used where the properties do the most good and during his talk the speaker demonstrated the unusual qualities of many of the new chemical developments.
