Magistrate's Court At Georgetown

On Thursday, June 28th at 10.00 A.M., in the Court House in Georgetown, Stipendiary Magistrate for King's County, Joseph W. MacDonald, K.C. held weekly court and disposed of a number of cases.

The first case involved a resident of Dingwell's Mills, charged under section 222 (B) of the Criminal Code, with creating a disturbance. The offence occurred in Georgetown. The accused pleaded guilty and was found guilty and sentenced to pay a fine of \$50.00, and costs or to serve two months in King's County Jail.

A resident of Fortune charged under section 283 (c) of the Criminal Code, with driving a motor vehicle on the street in Georgetown, recklessly or in a manner which is dangerous to the public. The accused pleaded guilty and was sentenced to pay a fine of \$50.00 and costs or to serve two months in King's County Jail.

A resident of Dingwell's Mills pleaded guilty to driving a motor vehicle without an operator's license under section 51 (b) of the Highway Traffic Act and was fined \$5.00 and costs or 10 days. The same party also pleaded guilty to a charge under section 283 (c) of the Criminal Code of driving a motor vehicle on the streets in

A resident of Gasperaux entered a plea of guilty to having liquor in a place other than his residence and was fined \$20.00 and costs. A resident of Iona in Queens County pleaded guilty to a charge of being intoxicated in a public place under section 36 (2) of the Temperance Act and was fined \$20.00 and costs. The same party also pleaded guilty to a charge of obstructing a peace officer in the execution of his duty under section 168 (A) of the Criminal Code of

Minister Inducted At Georgetown

The Rev. W. A. Paterson, M.A. B.D., was inducted into the pastorate of the Georgetown United Pastoral Charge, which comprises Georgetown, Sturgeon and Milltown Cross at a service held in St. David's United Church, Georgetown, on Friday, June 29th at 8.00 p.m.

Rev. W. T. Mercer of Mount Stewart, Rev. Russell MacLeod of St. Peter's and Rev. Wallace MacPherson of Murray Harbour, all members of the Prince Edward Island Presbytery were in attendance. The induction ceremony was performed by Rev. Mercer. Rev. MacLeod read the lesson and prayers and Rev. MacPherson delivered the sermon. Rev. Paterson gave the benediction. Mr. B. H. Stewart and Captain Henry Larsen, church elders, presented Rev. Paterson for induction.

The new pastor was introduced to members of the congregation in the church. Following the ceremony at the church, Rev. Paterson and Mrs. Paterson were entertained at the home of Mrs. W. W. MacLaren by the members of the Official Board and their wives. Born in Hants County, N.S., the Rev. Paterson has had a colorful career. After teaching school in Nova Scotia and Saskatchewan, he went overseas in 1915 as a member of the Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry. After being wounded twice, he received a commission in the Gordon Highlanders, serving with them for 18 months. Following the First World War he took his M.A. degree at Edinburgh University and later his B.A. degree at Pine Hill Divinity Hall, Halifax.

He was ordained in 1924, and has held pastorates at Cavendish, Montrose and St. Peter's Bay. During the last war he served as a chaplain in the Royal Canadian Navy. Prior to coming to Georgetown Rev. Paterson was in charge of Lockport, N.S. United Church.

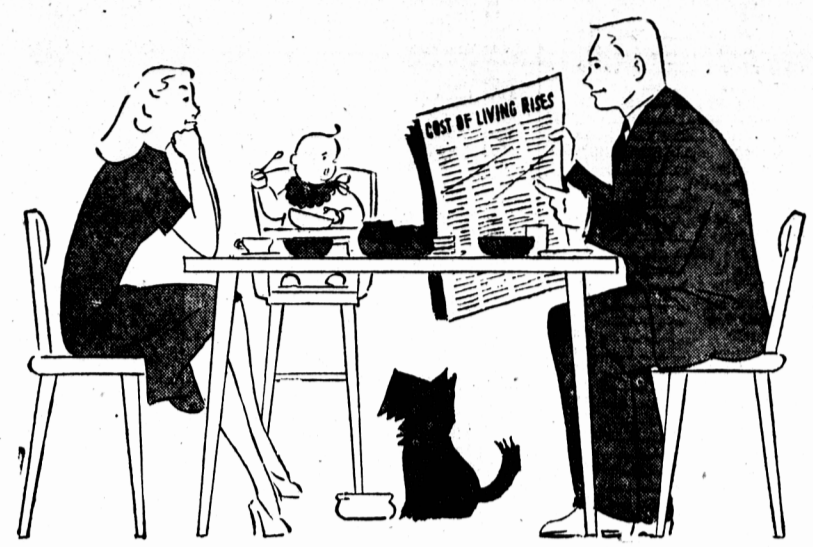
