Sealing Authority to Lecture at UPEI

An international authority on seals and sealing, Dr. Keith Ronald, will be delivering a public lecture at the University of Prince Edward Island on Thursday, February 26. Dr. Ronald is the Dean of Biological Sciences at the University of Guelph. He will be speaking on The Harp Seal, its Life and Death and other Problems in the Biological, Physical and Political Sciences. Dr. Ronald will also speak of PEI's marine life in general. His talk is at 8 p.m. in the Duffy Amphitheatre.

A native of Wales,

Dr. Ronald is a graduate of McGill University. His research interests include: ecophysiology of seals and he has been a project leader for studies on migration, Arctic ecology, polar bear ecophysiology and Arctic Population Modelling.

Dr. Ronald's research and lecture tours have taken him all over the world. His studies include available habitats for the Mediterranean Monk Seal, and a survey of breeding areas for endangered bird species for the Smithsonian Institute. His subject areas include: Wildlife Parasitology, Radiation Biology and Special Projects in Ecology.
