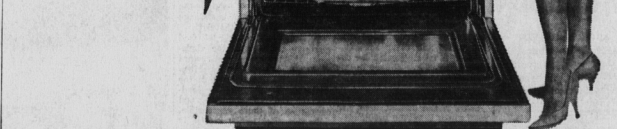

Smallest Quint Causes Doctor 'Most Worry'

MARACAIBO, Venezuela (AP) Nurses carefully fed nourishment to the Prieto quintuplets Tuesday to bolster their well-regarded chances of survival. Each gram was considered important. The babies' weights ranged from three pounds 14 ounces to four pounds three ounces at birth Saturday, but all lost some weight because they could not be fed in their first 24 hours in incubators. "The smallest one, Oita, worries me the most, but he has already improved," reported Dr. Regulo Pancharo, Asst. chief of pediatrics at the University Hospital and a member of the six-man medical team supervising the quintuplets' care. Doctors said the quintuplets will remain in incubators until they each weigh about 4.5 pounds. Robinson, the first born, and Mario, the last, were already at about four pounds. Juan Jose and Fernando, the third and fourth born, were reported gaining on their original matching weights of three pounds 14 ounces. However, Otto was still below his original three pounds 4.9 ounces.

Jury Returns True Bill In Box Combine

TORONTO (CP) — A grand jury returned a true bill of indictment Tuesday accusing 11 paper box companies of operating a combine between 1947 and 1954. The trial is expected to start early next year. The companies accused of conspiring to prevent or lessen competition are: St. Lawrence Corporation Limited, Corrugated Paper Box Limited, Acme Paper Products Company Limited, Bathurst Paper and Power Company Limited, Bathurst Containers Limited, Bathurst Canadian Wireboard Boxes and Shipping Containers Limited, Kraft Containers Limited, Maritime Paper Products Limited, Crown Zellerbach Limited, Canadian Boxes Limited, Galt Company of Canada Limited, Henrichsoff Paper Products Limited, Hygrade Containers Limited, Martin Paper Products Holdings Limited, Sherbrooke Paper Products Limited, Paper Box Manufacturing Limited and Superior Box Company Limited.

Wheat Sale To Russia Announced By Board

WINNIPEG (CP) — The Canadian Wheat Board announced Tuesday Russia has made an \$11,200,000 — bushel purchase of Canadian wheat worth \$22,000,000. Negotiators for the two countries closed the cash deal in Ottawa. Half the total of 300,000 long tons will be shipped from Pacific ports and half from St. Lawrence ports. The Canadian Press reported Aug. 29 that Russia had made an \$11,000,000-bushel purchase worth around \$20,000,000. There was no official confirmation at the time, although Trade Minister Sharp said that negotiations for a wheat sale to Russia were in the final stage. Officials here said the sale was negotiated in conjunction with Ottawa talks on a new Canada — Russia trade agreement. But it was not known whether the sale was to be part of any projected agreement. Wheat board Commissioner, W. C. McNamara has been in Ottawa several days attending the talks. At the time the sale was first reported Mr. Sharp said it would likely be related either to the expiring trade agreement or the new one. He said "we are hoping we can develop a fairly steady market in Russia for wheat. Russia's last purchase of Canadian wheat was a 7,500,000-bushel lot in February, 1961.
