Outstanding Railway Official Retires, Had 44-Year Career

MONTREAL.—A 44-year career that encompassed a succession of chief vice-presidents of the continent's largest railroad system came to a close today with the retirement of W. H. Hobbs, vice-president of Canadian National Railways.

William Henry Hobbs had a close association with all departments and divisions of the CNR and its predecessor, the Grand Trunk Railway, in which he began his career. As secretary to the late Sir Henry Thornton during Sir Henry's entire tenure as first president of the CNR, Mr. Hobbs had an intimate knowledge of the formative years of the present wide-spread system.

Mr. Hobbs had intimate and general administrative experience with the CNR since 1914 he became private secretary to the president of the Grand Trunk and in 1927 the Pacific Railway and subsequent served two other presidents and research.

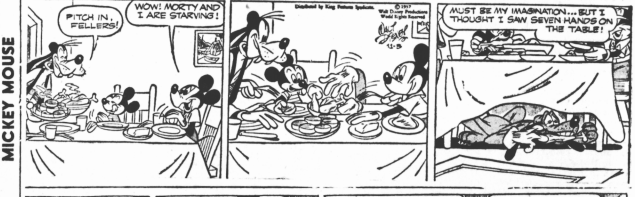
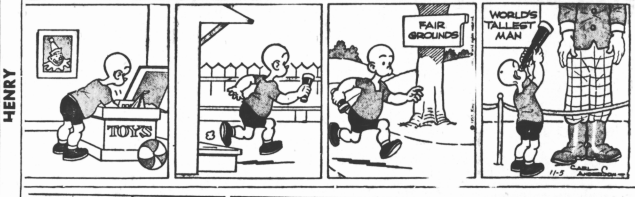
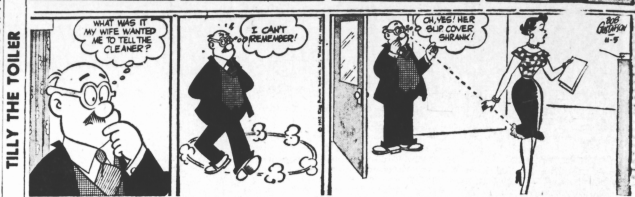
