Not wishing to disturb him, he was silent for a minute or so, but feeling slightly uncomfortable at Sir Hugh's silence, he spoke, but received no answer. Advancing, he was inexpressibly shocked to find that his father was past all human aid. Of the letter which Sir Hugh had intended to write, the words "My dear William" alone stood as witnesses to his unfulfilled intention.—Montreal Star.
