

Two Island Scholarships From Convent Alumnae

SAINT JOHN, N. B. — Two scholarships and a bursary have been awarded to Prince Edward Island teachers this year by the Canadian Federation of Convent Alumnae, it has been announced by the Federation's scholarship committee chairman, Miss Mary Chaisson of Saint John, N. B.

Sister St. Rita of Notre Dame Academy, Charlottetown, is taking a summer course in theology at Providence College, Rhode Island, under the Marguerite Bourgeoys Scholarship established by the Notre Dame Alumnae Association in Charlottetown in 1942.

Sister St. Mary Herbert of St. Mary's Convent, Souris, is taking a summer course in philosophy at St. Dunstan's University, Charlottetown, under the Cardinal McGuigan Scholarship established by the federation in 1944.

From its bursary fund, the federation has granted Sister St. Mary Sixtus of Marian Academy, Miscouche, a bursary to buy scientific apparatus.

These scholarships and bursary are among 26 scholarships and 10 bursaries granted this year by the Federation to teaching Sisters all over Canada for post-graduate, undergraduate and special studies.

The awards are open to all teachers of religious communities whose alumnae associations are affiliated with the Canadian Federation of Convent Alumnae.

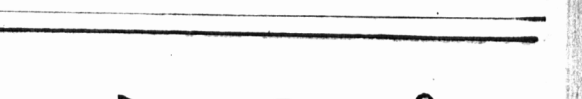
