## ST. DUNSTAN'S.

Commencement Exercises at the College.

The spacious new Convocation Hall of St. Dunstan's was gaily and tastefully decorated, yesterday afternoon, with British and Canadian flags, and red white and blue. There was a good audience, including the Lieutenant Governor and Miss McIntyre, the Bishop of Charlottetown, the Master of the Rolls, His Worship the Mayor, Premier Farquharson, Mrs. and Miss Farquharson, Dr. Morrison, Dr. Taylor and Mrs. Taylor, Dr. Doyle, Dr. Conroy and Mrs. Conroy, Dr. McMillan, Dr. D. J. McLeod, Superintendent of Education, Dr. Dickey, Rev. Father Meenan, of Moncton; Rev. J. Eneas McDonald, of Hope River; Rev. R. B. McDonald, of Rustico; Rev. Stephen Pheasant, of Georgetown; Rev. J. J. McDonald, of Kinkora; D. O. M. R. ddu and Mrs. Reddin, Miss Youngblood, Mrs. Haadraban and Miss Fennessy, Mrs. Maurice Blake, Miss McMillan, of Charlottetown, J. A. Ready, B. A., of New London; J. T. Mellish, M. A., Hon. James Richards, M. L. A., Professor Caven and others prominent in Church and State.

The programme as published was well rendered, the music by the college band and choir being alike excellent, and the papers and addresses well written and delivered. We regret that THE EXAMINER does not afford space to-day for the well written valedictory address, in which reference was made to recent improvements in the college building and appurtenances and to the care and ability bestowed upon the pupils by the Rev. Rector and other members of the Faculty. The exceedingly able address of Dr. C. Campbell—applicable practically by young men of all denominations—we hope to publish in full, on Saturday next. Towards the close of the programme the following address was read and presented to His Honor the Lieutenant Governor:

St. Dunstan's College,  
June 12th, 1906.

To His Honor Lieutenant-Governor McIntyre,

In your official capacity, as Lieutenant-Governor of Prince Edward Island, you today make an initial visit to Saint Dunstan's College. The students seize the first opportunity of publicly congratulating you on your elevation to the Lieutenant-Governorship, of conveying to you some token of the respect we feel for your person, and the satisfaction we experience on seeing entrusted to your charge the important functions of the chief magistracy. We need not comment on those abilities or endowments which eminently fit you to make the vice-regal chair the embodiment of grace, dignity and distinction.

Your demeanor toward us as students—a fact we have not failed to appreciate—has always been characteristic of kindness and courtesy. But another, a more lasting and a more binding connection exists between us,—a connection which neither time nor place can separate. You are an old student of St. Dunstan's. This is your Alma Mater. A peculiar virtue rather than a peculiar vanity,—the college student never regards as a mere stranger one whose intellect has been cast in the same mould as his own. He sees in the student of the past not only a predecessor, but also a precursor. And this circumstance lends an infinite degree of pleasure to the heart-felt welcome which we extend to you to-day. In concluding our tribute we wish you, together with Mrs. McIntyre, many years of happiness as Her Majesty's representatives on Prince Edward Island.

## ADDRESS TO REV. DR. MONAGHAN.

Dr. Monaghan has severed his connection with St. Dunstan's College to take a position on the staff of St. Dunstan's Cathedral. Yesterday morning he was presented by the students with an ebony gold-headed cane and the following address:

To the Rev. Dr. Monaghan:

Among the farewell greetings which we make today we are forced to pronounce one which, a few days ago, we had no thought of pronouncing. Were it in our power, we would first remove the cause that constrains us to utter this unexpected adieu—so suddenly came the announcement that the end of this scholastic year would witness the termination of your labors, for a time at least, within the walls of St. Dunstan's College. For the past three years you have occupied a position—perhaps the most important, certainly the most enviable—which the institution could assign—that of Prefect of Discipline. After occupying such a position, and for such a period, the highest praise we can bestow is that we sincerely regret your departure.

Many of the older students who have flourished, both mentally and morally, under your charge feel that you have no small share in shaping their destinies. As a teacher you enlightened us; as a priest you edified us. You leave behind you a memorial erected in the hearts of those whom you instructed—a memorial which future associations can never cloud, nor time destroy. Assuring you that wherever you go you will be followed by our best of good wishes, we desire that you accept, inadequate though it be, this souvenir of our esteem.
