WHEAT AND PORK.—An exchange reports that wheat closed in Chicago on Saturday at 72 1/2 and May corn at 27 1/2, which are the highest points reached by both on the present advance. January pork closed at 12 1/2, an advance of 3/4 cent from the opening quotations Saturday. The advance in the December option of pork was even greater than that of January. The gain in price of pork has been about 2.00 per barrel from bottom.

Her machinery, which consists of triple expansion engines, will be supplied by Messrs. Muir & Houston. She was gracefully named Princess by Miss Edith Miller, daughter of the builder.

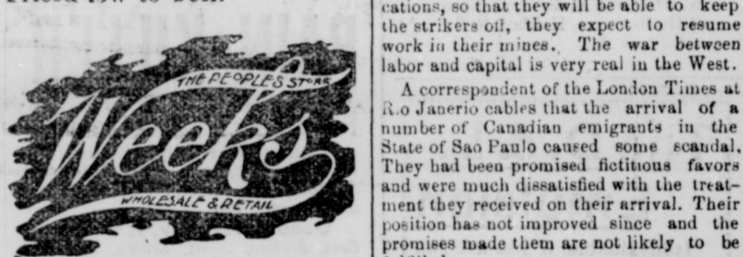
