NEW YORK

NEW YORK (AP) — The indictment of U.S. Steel and Bethlehem came Thursday as a dash of cold water to a stock market. The result was inevitable: Another market slump paced by steels, and a new 1962 low for the market.
In early trading the steels were making a moderate recovery from sharp losses taken in Wednesday's selloff. Word that a federal grand jury had indicted U.S. Steel and Bethlehem and two major companies on charges of conspiracy to fix prices and rig bids resulted in immediate erasure of the gains and a sharp drop, with heavy selling.

As unloading of stocks reached its peak in the final hour the ticker tape ran three minutes behind transactions.
