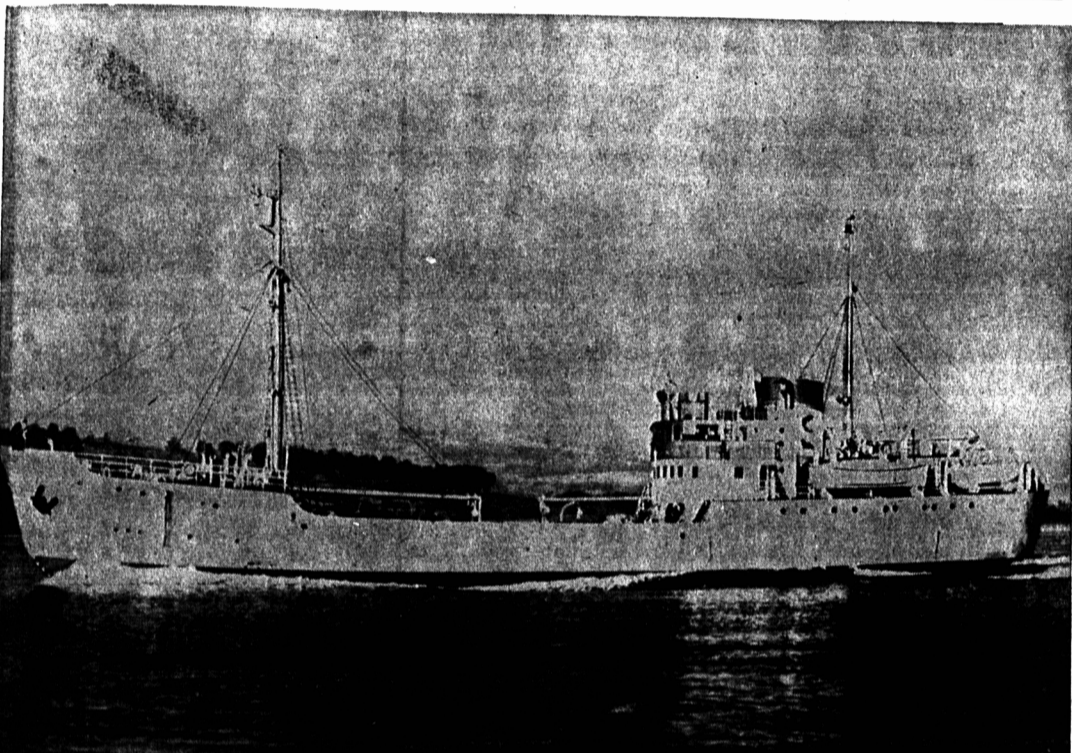


S'IDE WATERFRONT BUSY SPOT NOW

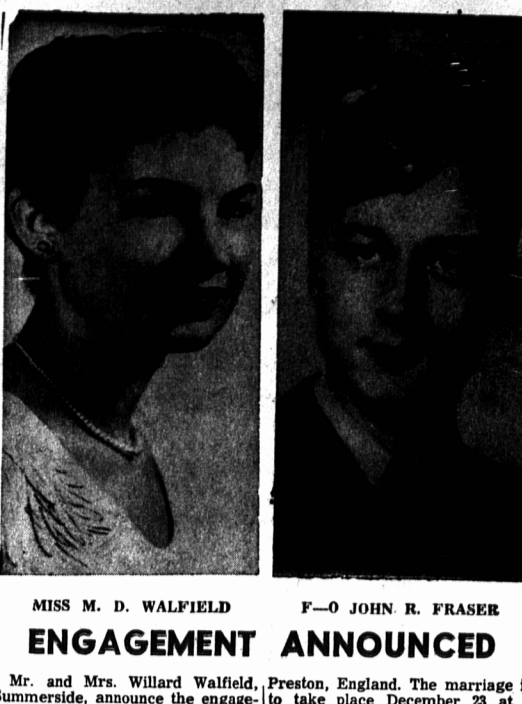
