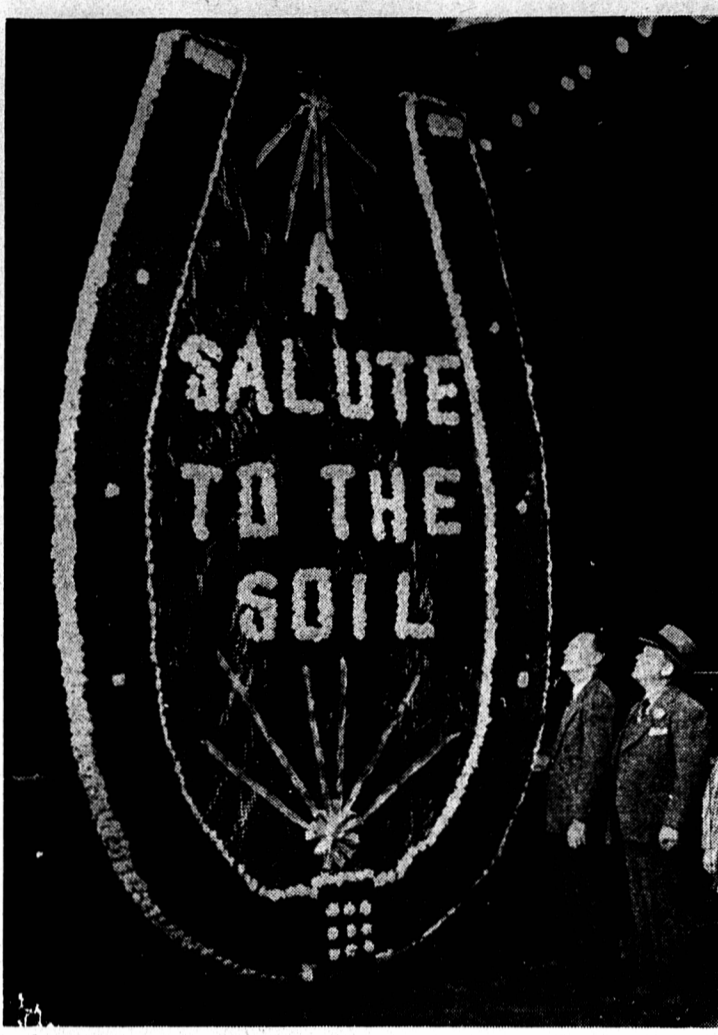
Gallant-Gallant Wedding
