One Man Taken To Hospital After Three-Car Smashup

A three-car pile at the Carleton crossing about a mile west of Borden last evening resulted in one man being hospitalized and heavy damage to all three vehicles.

Gordon Jay of Borden, driver of one of the cars, was taken to Prince County Hospital but his injuries are reported as not serious. He suffered lacerations and an injury to his left leg.

Names of the other drivers and occupants of the two cars were not available last evening. However it is known that one car involved, a 1959 Chevrolet was from New Brunswick and a 1955 Dodge the third vehicle in the mishap was from Charlottetown.

The New Brunswick car was proceeding toward Borden while the Jay vehicle stopped at the intersection on the Bedeque side of the highway and the third vehicle was approaching from the Cape Traverse Road.

This vehicle apparently came out onto the Trans-Canada highway, colliding with the New Brunswick car and veering over into the stopped Jay vehicle.

The New Brunswick and Charlottetown vehicles were badly damaged and had to be towed into a nearby garage. The Jay vehicle, although extensively damaged, was driven away under its own power.

Dr. Peter MacDonald of Crapaud treated the other occupants for minor injuries.

The Borden detachment RCMP investigated.

Elmer Dunning, well known commercial traveller in this province, passed away at Victoria General Hospital, Halifax, on Friday, September 4th, in his 60th year.

The late Mr. Dunning was born in Summerside and after completing his education began his commercial travelling career throughout the province. During the later war years he was appointed manager of Bergmann's Enterprises at Montague, a position he held for several years.

An accomplished singer and choir director, he directed the choir of St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church at Montague of which he was a faithful member. He was twice married. His first wife, the former Olive Morrison passed away several years ago, and his second wife, Mrs. Sadie Garrick pre-deceased him only a few years ago.

He leaves to mourn two daughters, Shirlee, Mrs. Duncan Robinson, and Roma, Mrs. Don Schaffner, both of Middleton, N.S.

The funeral will be held from St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, Montague, on Monday, September 7th at 2 p.m. Interment will be in the Montague Community cemetery.
